Statutory & Regulatory Authority:

AS 04.11.480. Protest. (a) A local governing body may protest the issuance, renewal, relocation, or transfer to another person of a license, issuance, renewal, or transfer to another person of a license with one or more endorsements, or issuance of an endorsement by sending the board and the applicant a protest and the reasons for the protest within 60 days of the date of the notice of filing of the application. A protest received after the 60-day period may not be accepted by the board, and in no event may a protest cause the board to reconsider an approved renewal, relocation, or transfer. The local governing body may protest the continued operation of a license or endorsement during the second year of the biennial license period by sending the board and the licensee a protest and the reasons for the protest by January 31 of the second year of the license. The procedures for action on a protest of continued operation of a license or endorsement are the same as the procedures for action on a protest of a renewal application. The board shall consider a protest and testimony received at a hearing conducted under AS 04.11.510(b)(2) or (4) when it considers the application or continued operation, and the protest and the record of the hearing conducted under AS 04.11.510(b)(2) or (4) shall be kept as part of the board's permanent record of its review. If an application or continued operation is protested, the board shall deny the application or continued operation unless the board finds that the protest is arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable.

(c) A local governing body may recommend that a license be issued, renewed, relocated, or transferred, or that a license with one or more endorsements be issued, renewed, or transferred to another person, with conditions. The board shall consider recommended conditions and testimony received at a hearing conducted under AS 04.11.510(b)(2) or (4) when it considers the application or continued operation, and the recommended conditions and the record of the hearing conducted under AS 04.11.510(b)(2) or (4) shall be kept as part of the board's permanent record of its review. If the local governing body recommended conditions, the board shall impose the recommended conditions unless the board finds that the recommended conditions are arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable. If a condition recommended by a local governing body is imposed on a licensee, the local governing body shall

assume responsibility for monitoring compliance with the condition, except as otherwise provided by the board.

(d) In addition to the right to protest under (a) of this section, a local governing body may notify the board that the local governing body has determined that a licensee has violated a provision of this title or a condition imposed on the licensee by the board. Unless the board finds that the local governing body's determination is arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable, the board shall prepare the determination as an accusation against the licensee under AS 44.62.360 and conduct proceedings to resolve the matter as described under AS 04.11.510(c).

3 AAC 305.085. Local governing body protest. (a) A local governing body may protest an application filed under this chapter. The protest must be in writing, filed with the board, and copied to the applicant, and must include the governing body's reason for the protest. The reasons stated by a local governing body must be logical grounds for opposing the application or continued operation of the license and have a reasonable basis in fact. Under this section, a protest may be filed for

- (2) the continued operation of a license or endorsement issued under this chapter; under this paragraph, a local governing body may only protest the continued operation of a license or endorsement during the second year of the biennial license period if the local governing body files the protest and the reasons for the protest with the board and copies the licensee not later than January 31 of the second year of the license.
 - (b) The board will not take final action upon an application until at least
- (1) 60 days after a local governing body receives the notice issued by the board required by AS 04.11.520, unless the local governing body waives the right to protest the application in writing to the director; and
 - (2) 15 days after completion of public notice of the application.
- (c) A protest received after the 60-day period may not be accepted by the board. A protest may not cause the board to reconsider an approved renewal, transfer of location, or transfer to another person.
- (d) A local governing body that protests an application shall allow the applicant a reasonable opportunity to defend the application before a meeting of the local governing body.
- (e) A local governing body protest may be based upon facts that render the particular application objectionable to the local body or may be based upon a general public policy. If based on a general public policy, the policy must have a reasonable basis in fact, may not be contrary to law, and may not be patently inapplicable to the particular application being protested. The board will not substitute the board's judgment for that of the local governing body on a matter of public policy that has reasonable factual support.

(h) The board may uphold a protest of an application or continued operation with an initial abeyance period of not more than 180 days if the local governing body indicates that the protest is subject to rescission and that it will be withdrawn if the applicant meets conditions set by the local governing body. If the local governing body notifies the board within the period of the abeyance that the protest has been removed, the application or continued operation will be approved when all other applicable requirements have been met. If the local governing body has not notified the board within the period of the abeyance that the local governing body has removed the protest, the application or continued operation is denied.

To: The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board,

The Kodiak City Council is lodging a protest with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the continued use and operation of the Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant REPL License No. 2611. The City Council had limited documentation and lacked familiarity with Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office processes within the initial 60-day protest period set by AMCO. The City Council held a public hearing on October 10, 2024, following the postponement of the action from the July 25 and August 8, 2024, regular meetings. Stephanie Kim spoke during the meeting on August 8, 2024, to inform the Council of the challenges to reopen Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant.

Upon further review of the renewal application submitted by Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant dated December 26, 2023, the restaurant's application for renewal as stated in their forms AB-17 and AB-33 includes data for food and alcohol revenue generated in 2022 and 2023. The restaurant had originally filed \$0 on City sales tax returns for 2023. It is our understanding the City can protest the second year of continued operations pursuant to AS 04.11.480. Please accept this protest due to inconsistencies filed in their application while remitting taxes and inability to provide restaurant and eating place services while holding this license. The City of Kodiak further protests this license on the grounds that the Building Official indicated the physical location of 116 W Rezanof Dr. is a vacant building and that it was renovated without the permits required by Kodiak City Code, and the Fire Marshall indicated the building is not compliant with fire inspection requirements.

A public hearing was held on this protest on October 24, 2024, during the City Council regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. in the Kodiak Public Library. Ms. Kim was notified of the meeting and her opportunity to participate.

REPL No. 2611 is currently designated as "active-temporarily surrendered" as a result of the loss of its operational location. It is well known that the restaurant has not operated for several years, including the years referenced in the application; therefore, we request enforcement investigate the validity of this application.

Kodiak has four REPL licenses available. There are businesses currently operating in Kodiak that have expressed interest in applying for one of the licenses held by the licensee. The City of Kodiak fully supports

economic growth and development; therefore, the Kodiak City Council supports a protest of continued renewal of the REPL No. 2611 that is inactive and issued until December 31, 2025. We request that this matter be reviewed at the next Alcoholic Beverage Control Board meeting in November.

SUMMARY AND DISCUSSION:

The City of Kodiak is in receipt of a Restaurant or Eating Place License (REPL) application for renewal no. 2611 from the Alcohol Beverage Control Board for Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant. A local governing body may protest the approval of an application pursuant to AS 04.11.480 with clear and concise reason for protest within 60 days of receipt of the notice and allowing the applicant an opportunity to defend the application.

The City Clerk received the renewal and sent inquiry to the Fire Marshal, Finance Director, Chief of Police, and Building Official to review the license and ensure the establishment was in compliance with Kodiak City Code. The Finance Department is recommending the City Council protest this license renewal due to non-remittance of sales tax. It was also noted from City staff that the licensee is not operating from the physical address on their application.

The City Clerk sent a letter to Sizzler Burger and Peking Restaurant on July 18, 2024, notifying them of the recommendation to protest at a regular Council meeting. At this time the Clerk has not made further contact with the applicant after multiple attempts.

A resolution is before Council to protest, subject to rescission, for the renewal of the REPL No. 2611 Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant for non-compliance of City Code Sections 3.08.140 failure to remit sales tax.

Update: 10/03/2024:

Over the past two weeks, the Finance Director has worked through the Acting City Manager and City Attorney to write a letter to the business owner to detail the type of supporting documentation required by the Finance Department to review amended sales tax returns. A copy of the letter is in tonight's packet.

On September 29, two certified letters were sent to the business owner at a physical address and a mailing address listed on file. The letter in tonight's packet received legal approval and concurrence to be admissible in the regular council meeting because it directly relates to an official investigation. In the attached letter, the Finance Director requested the supporting documentation be received by the Finance Department by Tuesday, October 8, 2024, to consider reviewing the amended sales tax returns.

The supporting documentation required should include, but is not limited to, the following:

- Profit and Loss Statements.
- Actual tax transcripts showing what was claimed as income and expenses.
- Receipts of all transactions.

If the Finance Department receives supporting documentation by October 8th, then the Finance Director can review to determine if those amended returns are acceptable for potential approval consideration.

In addition, the Finance Director reached out to AMCO on Thursday, October 3rd and was notified that REPL #2611 was changed from 'Active to Actively-Temporarily Surrendered' since they had been notified in June 2024 that the licensee was no longer operating the license. AMCO reiterated that the 60-day deadline to protest had passed so that decision is final. Although the deadline has expired for a protest decision, AMCO shared that the local governing body can protest the second year of operations. Since the current REPL does not expire until 12/31/2025, the Council has the opportunity to protest the second year (2025) of operations through a letter to AMCO. If the Council decides to protest the second year of operations, then the letter must be submitted to AMCO by the end of October 2024. By submitting the letter to AMCO by the deadline, this will allow the request to be presented at AMCO's next Board Meeting scheduled in Anchorage and/or via Zoom on November 19, 2024 beginning at 09:00 AKST.

Based on our records, every quarter in 2023 and the first two quarters in 2024 were filed as zero either inperson or through MuniRevs. Each filing received, the method of filing, and dates are listed below:

- 1. QTR 1 of 2023 was filed in-person on April 28, 2023 and the amount claimed was \$0.00.
- 2. QTR 2 of 2023 was filed electronically through MuniRevs on July 27, 2023 and the amount claimed was \$0.00.
- 3. QTR 3 of 2023 was filed in-person on October 16, 2023 and the amount claimed was \$0.00.
- 4. QTR 4 of 2023 was filed electronically through MuniRevs on February 11, 2024 and the amount claimed was \$0.00.
- 5. QTR 1 of 2024 was filed in-person on July 23, 2024 and the amount claimed was \$0.00.
- 6. QTR 2 of 2024 was filed in-person on July 22, 2024 and the amount claimed was \$0.00.

On Thursday, August 8, 2024, Ms. Kim came into the Finance Department to provide updated amended sales tax filings for 2022 and QTRs 3 and 4 of 2023. On the same day, the Deputy Finance Director spoke with Ms. Kim and explained that based on KCC 3.08.162 for amended returns, all 2022 amended sales tax filings were not eligible for review because these were past the one-year due date from the original returns. In addition, the Deputy Finance Director explained that the 2023 amended sales tax filings could not be reviewed until we received supporting documentation and a written justification for requesting approval for amended return consideration. It was also explained that that Ms. Kim must agree to submit to an audit upon the request of the city. The information was provided verbally in-person, and was also emailed on Thursday, August 8th, 2024.

On September 9, 2024, the City Clerk was emailed a written justification for the amended sales taxes to be reviewed. The e-mail included the amended sales tax returns for QTRs 3 and 4 of 2023 for Sizzler Burger and agreement to submit to an audit upon request of the City. Unfortunately, the documentation provided was not the supporting documentation necessary for the city finance department to review. As a result, the Finance Department rejects the submitted amended sales tax returns.

Kodiak City Code 3.08.162 (a) states: "A seller may file an amended sales tax return, with supporting documentation, and the city may accept the amended return...". Mrs. Kim and family must provide actual supporting documents which includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Profit and Loss statements
- Actual tax transcripts showing what was claimed as income and expenses
- Receipts of all transactions

Unless the supporting documentation listed above is provided to the Finance Department by Tuesday, October 8th, the rejection of the submitted amended sales tax returns will remain unchanged. Being delinquent in your tax obligations may lead to action being taken with regard to Restaurant and Eating Place License (REPL) #2611 held by Sizzler Burger and Peking Restaurant.

WHEREAS, the City of Kodiak received an application for renewal of Restaurant or Eating Place License No. 2611 on June 11, 2024; and

WHEREAS, staff reviewed the application and the Finance Director issued a recommendation to protest based upon the submittal of Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant's application dated December 26, 2023, to AMCO declaring business operations in 2022 and 2023, but not having remitted sales tax to the City of Kodiak for those years; and

WHEREAS, the Building Official reviewed the application and indicated the physical location of 116 W. Rezanof Dr. is a vacant building and that it was renovated without the permits required by Kodiak City Code; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Chief reviewed the application and indicated that 116 W. Rezanof Dr. is not compliant with fire inspection requirements, due in part to the lack of a building permit application; and

WHEREAS, per Alaska Statute 04.11.480, a local governing body may protest the issuance, renewal, relocation, or transfer to another person of a license by sending the board and the applicant a protest and the reasons for the protest within 60 days of receipt from the board of notice of filing of the application; and

WHEREAS, if a protest is filed, the board will deny the application unless the board finds that the protest is arbitrary, capricious, and unreasonable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Kodiak, Alaska, hereby protests, subject to rescission, renewal of Restaurant or Eating Place License No. 2611 Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant for non-compliance with City Code Section 3.08.140; to wit, failure to submit sales tax returns in 2022 and 2023;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk is instructed to communicate this protest to the Alaska Alcoholic Beverage Control Board;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this protest shall be rescinded upon the applicant filing accurate sales tax returns, with remittance of taxes owed, for 2022 and 2023;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall promptly communicate to the Alaska Alcoholic Beverage Control Board the applicant's satisfaction of the above requirements and recession of this protest if and when such satisfaction and rescission occurs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

The Kodiak City Council is lodging a protest with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the continued use and operation of the Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant REPL License No. 2611. The City Council had limited documentation and lack of familiarity with Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office processes within the initial 60-day protest period set by AMCO. The City Council held a public hearing on October 10, 2024, following the postponement of the action from the July 25 and August 8, 2024, regular meetings. Stephanie Kim spoke during the meeting on August 8, 2024, to inform the Council of the challenges to reopen Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant.

Upon further review of the renewal application submitted by Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant dated December 26, 2023, the restaurant's application for renewal as stated in their forms AB-17 and AB-33 includes data for food and alcohol revenue generated in 2022 and 2023. The restaurant had originally filed \$0 on City sales tax returns for 2023. It is our understanding the City can protest the second year of continued operations pursuant to AS 04.11.480. Please accept this protest due to inconsistencies filed in their application while remitting taxes and inability to provide restaurant and eating place services while holding this license. A public hearing was held on this protest on October 24, 2024, during the City Council regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. in the Kodiak Public Library. Ms. Kim was notified of the meeting and her opportunity to participate.

REPL No. 2611 is currently designated as "active-temporarily surrendered" as a result of the loss of its operational location. It is well known that the restaurant has not operated for several years, including the years referenced in the application.

Kodiak has four REPL licenses available. There are businesses currently operating in Kodiak that have expressed interest in applying for one of the licenses held by the licensee. The City of Kodiak fully supports economic growth and development; therefore, the Kodiak City Council supports a protest of continued renewal of the REPL No. 2611 that is inactive and issued until December 31, 2025. We request that this matter be reviewed at the next Alcoholic Beverage Control Board meeting in November.

One of Kodiak's longtime restaurants is in jeopardy of having its license revoked by the State of Alaska. The two local municipal governments were split on how to handle a license renewal application from Peking Restaurant, in downtown Kodiak.

The Sizzler Burger and Peking Restaurant has been a staple in Kodiak, in some form or another, for roughly 40 years. The local eatery also holds one of only four Restaurant or Eating Place Licenses (REPLs) within the city, which allows it to serve beer and wine.

But for the past year or more the restaurant has been closed although when it officially stopped operating in its current building in downtown Kodiak on 116 W. Rezanof Drive is unknown. According to the business license tracked in a state database, Sizzler Burger and Peking Restaurant's business license expired at the end of 2023.

"We are no longer in that building. We were tenants in that same location for over 40 years, going through four different owners," Stephanie Kim-Kurosawa told the Kodiak Island Borough Assembly.

Kim-Kurosawa is the daughter of the owner of the restaurant and called into the Kodiak Island Borough Assembly meeting on Aug. 1. Sung Kim is the business owner but the REPL renewal application for Peking Restaurant was submitted by Sook C. Yun.

Kim-Kurosawa said they are actively looking for another building to operate out of. She said she spoke with the state and believes the restaurant should be allowed to maintain its license without having a physical building. Gabriel Gonzales, the local government specialist with AMCO, told KMXT that a business like Peking could maintain its REPL without period operation through something called a "waiver of operations."

"There are options for us to do. And if we don't, if we can't, if we cannot find a restaurant, and we don't have deep enough pockets...I mean we are exercising every option, including possibly building something on our lot," Kim-Kurosawa said.

The two-story building downtown where Peking Restaurant was once located, across from the KANA Marketplace, is not up to code anyways.

During the Aug. 1 meeting, Nova Javier, the Borough clerk, told the assembly that various departments documented zoning and potential safety issues with the Peking building.

"Community Development had some concern with conformity with regulation required by code zoning compliance. So there's zoning regulations, issues that we ran up with, and then the fire marshal. There is a need to conduct a fire and life safety inspection before he can recommend approval. The building official also commented that the business location has been gutted by the building owner without any permits. It is believed that the business has not been in operation for two years," Javier explained.

Despite these issues, Borough Assembly member Ryan Sharratt urged the assembly to let the state decide on the license renewal and not take steps locally that could inhibit economic growth in the community.

"It's up to AMCO, not up to us whether to renew that license. But I firmly believe that as a governing body of the Kodiak Island Borough, we should support businesses. We should support free enterprise and economic development," Sharratt stated.

The Assembly ultimately voted to not protest the license renewal for Peking Restaurant.

But the City of Kodiak wanted to object to the license renewal. City staff say the restaurant has not remitted sales tax to the city for 2022 or 2023 when the business was still listed as being in operation. So the city council was slated to protest the renewal of Peking (& Sizzler Burger's) Restaurant's license during its regular meeting on Aug. 8. Instead though the council granted a 60-day extension to the restaurant so it can address the outstanding issues before final recommendation is made to the state.

Although the Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office (AMCO), specifically the Alaska Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, will make the final decision, it is unclear if it will renew the Kodiak restaurant's license without a building space.

The state board's next meeting is scheduled for September 10-11 in Fairbanks. That meeting was originally going to be held in Kodiak but now that is pushed back to November.

This letter is to inform you that the review of Liquor License # 2611 renewal application for Sizzler Burger and Peking Restaurant is scheduled to be heard by the Kodiak Island Borough Assembly on August 1, 2024. The meeting will start at 6:30 p.m. in the Borough Assembly Chambers at 710 Mill Bay Road, Kodiak.

According to Alaska Statutes 04.11.480, and regulations in 3 AAC 305.085, the local governing body has the authority to protest renewal of a liquor license for public policy reasons or due to license-related issues. Pursuant to KIBC 5.01.020 the Clerk's Office investigated and has been advised that circumstances relating to the license renewal application support an objection by the governing body in order to protect the Borough's interests. Specifically, the Borough has an interest in licensed premises having proper building permits and zoning, and an interest in the information set out in the license application being accurate and complete. Even the backstreet was all blocked. We called them endless times asking them to move their vehicles, machineries, etc.

with no success.

Starting middle of 2022 was also very challenging with hiring help in Kodiak. Attached photos of our local business with signs "closed short of employees" or "referral bonus" When finally got the help we needed

While we were not at the restaurant, the owner of the building came in and told new help that he was the owner of the building and he was going to evict us and he would not have a job for long.

At the same time, many Kodiak businesses were closing. Restaurant businesses without a place to go. El Chicano was one of them. Their building was sold to a new owner and he wanted to renovate and took time to build apartment upstairs and restaurant kitchen concrete to dry before being inspected.

Catering businesses that were renting the kitchen of the convention center were also struggling with convention center being taken down to build rooms.

There were and still are not enough restaurant equipped properties (sprinkler, pipes, grease trap etc. to meet all the requirements for restaurants to rent. One space that was available was given to a cannery (Silver Bay) to rent to feed their employees. Having been a long-time resident in the city of Kodiak we also knew there were not enough restaurants like a "musical chair" and wanted to do what we could to keep restaurants stay in business. This too, was denied by the new landlord. Because we had a valid and legal lease until the end of 2026. We then helped one restaurant get into a property we were thinking of moving to.

It got harder after that with the owners doing everything that they can for us to operate our business as we always have.

Fall of 2023 We did a lot of research and flew to Seattle a few times and decided we were going to close the second floor starting January of 2024 and only have Sizzler burger Peking and put in golf stimulator with one sky track and a track man 4 IO for our talented golfers where 2nd floor space was. We were very excited because Mr. Kim and Mrs. Kim both have always believed physical recreation with Kodiak's weather, and believed it helped mental health awareness.

With this plan, Mrs. Kim decided in September of 2023 to give the full-service restaurant serving beer and wine license she did not need any more to Nuniaq. They are/will be a full-service restaurant and they can utilize it appropriately and Serve Kodiak. They are honest, hardworking young Kodiak residents that have always wanted to open a restaurant of her own and she did.

When Tony came to measure for screen and location in December for the box and to build solid for safety of machine protection for golf stimulator, owner came in and said he is the owner of the property will not allow it.

But final draw for us to give up on our place was when part of the ceiling in back dining fell down from them doing work on the building in 2024.

We Paid rent every month. We paid KEA every month. We had full liability insurance of the business. Other utilities as well were all finally turned off at the end of March 2024.

People don't even Live in a house for 40 years.

We were heartbroken with packing all the memories, equipments, dishes, silverware, etc. of our 40 plus years of life this year but our safety was first.

We helped bring "Dominos", we brought Sushi to Kodiak. We brought "Sparrow's" when we didn't have any pizza in town. We helped Nuniaq find a home and have beer and wine with full a restaurant service. We hope to do more if we can. This includes finding a home for sizzler Peking until Mrs. Kim is ready to fully retire.

We have in the past 40 years been prompt and paid on time.

With these unforeseen difficulties and challenges we were not able to operate as we have in the past.

We apologize for any inconvenience and we thank you for your time.

The Kodiak City Council is lodging a protest with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board for the continued use and operation of the Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant REPL License No. 2611. The City Council had limited documentation and lack of familiarity with Alcohol and Marijuana Control Office processes within the initial 60-day protest period set by AMCO. The City Council held a public hearing on October 10, 2024, following the postponement of the action from the July 25 and August 8, 2024, regular meetings. Stephanie Kim spoke during the meeting on August 8, 2024, to inform the Council of the challenges to reopen Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant.

Upon further review of the renewal application submitted by Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant dated December 26, 2023, the restaurant's application for renewal as stated in their forms AB-17 and AB-33 includes data for food and alcohol revenue generated in 2022 and 2023. The restaurant had originally filed \$0 on City sales tax returns for 2023. It is our understanding the City can protest the second year of continued operations pursuant to AS 04.11.480. Please accept this protest due to inconsistencies filed in their application while remitting taxes and inability to provide restaurant and eating place services while holding this license. A public hearing was held on this protest on October 24, 2024, during the City Council regular meeting at 6:30 p.m. in the Kodiak Public Library. Ms. Kim was notified of the meeting and her opportunity to participate.

REPL No. 2611 is currently designated as "active-temporarily surrendered" as a result of the loss of its operational location. It is well known that the restaurant has not operated for several years, including the years referenced in the application.

Kodiak has four REPL licenses available. There are businesses currently operating in Kodiak that have expressed interest in applying for one of the licenses held by the licensee. The City of Kodiak fully supports economic growth and development; therefore, the Kodiak City Council supports a protest of continued renewal of the REPL No. 2611 that is inactive and issued until December 31, 2025. We request that this matter be reviewed at the next Alcoholic Beverage Control Board meeting in November.

Also the questions and statements made by each one of you at the August 8th council meeting made us realize again, the importance/knowledge, and intelligence of the city councils. We too had all those questions and statements to the city up until the day of the meeting with no return call/ no availability.

"Disagreeing with protest" "give them 30 days" "Did they make an effort?"

"Covid shouldn't be the reason for other businesses are...."

"Suggestion of 60 days"

"I vote yes to 60 days because I don't have enough information"

Richard, Bob absolutely. None of you including myself had enough information at that moment.

Example:

Was 8/08 meeting necessary?

Was the votes of the council even necessary?

If the city staff would have responded. If the city staff gave accurate information to the council members but more importantly to us. If the city staff did not give inaccurate directions.

We spent weeks trying to reach someone from the office.

No return calls, return emails, not being able to see them. We tried.

We went to city office and someone said "hi Mrs.kim" we told her the reason we were there. She told us to go down stairs to the clerks office. She never told us she was the Financial Director. Many days calling the office leaving messages for both the clerk and acting manger, one staff said "you need to get in touch with Jennifer, the Finance Director" the person that directed us down stairs was Jennifer the Financial Director. I responded no, because we saw her, left messages and she hadn't so it has to be different department. The staff tracked her down and now she was forced to talk to us.

We finally speak for 3 minutes. Most of 3 minutes was her accusing us of false accusations. Told to submit the forms and said you have until the 8th.

We submitted the forms she instructed us to. We did not get response. Again, we call. We leave messages. We go to the city. She was never available.

8/08 later in the afternoon (the day of the meeting)we get "I am sorry - I am not aware of what you are talking about" if these are sales tax forms to go to sales tax department.

So go to the city. Staff are calculating the forms and when complete and we take our check book out,4:45 pm a gentleman comes over, with a piece of paper that the "Director" instructed to that we need different forms/process.

Our efforts in getting someone from the city to response included leaving voice messages, leaving a hand written contact information on the Finance Director's desk, physically going to the city office and waiting for her with no success. We left messages with other employees as well.

"How can the City Council do the important/ honorable roles it is designed for our community including voting with missing/ limited/ misleading information by a city staff?"

"The city office staff are at an office with phone numbers that we residents/ business owners have access/ need and have the right to reach. However when they do not, how are we to try and resolve any problems? How are we to understand what the problem is?"

"Was 60 days even needed? Consumption of the last 3 long months time necessary if these things were done by a city staff with the title "Director" in the first place?

Since July, We are still waiting on answers/ response from the city. One of those is "filing in person" on certain dates of 2023. These are impossible. The letter we have written the city will also confirm this. Those dates we were researching new addition of business to bring to Kodiak and was physically in a different State.

Reason for this letter to all of you Council Members is in hopes and wish this type of behavior from the City and its staff does not happen again to any other residents and or business owners.

Question: "who" from the city office without factual information and research that is so available from the state and city office full of staff apply and misinform/ promise this license to People.

This "inauthentic" information stated by a city staff was the only reason our other local government meeting came to an end. Not the reasons stated on the letter "the business location has been "gutted" by the building owner "without any permits" being one of the reasons. Which goes into why we suffered after the pandemic. We stayed and tried to until this year because it was our home and had rights to with a valid contract and paying until part of the ceiling fell.







Along with the working industry, our island also welcomes many out-of-town leisure visitors including sport fishermen and hunters, travelers, and several large cruise ships each Spring and Summer well into the Fall season. In 2018, Kodiak saw approximately 64,000 visitors that included 38,000 independent travelers and 26,000 cruise ship passengers. In 2024, we have 24,230 cruise passengers alone spanning over 22 different days throughout the seasons coming to visit our town which greatly impacts and adds to our local economy and small businesses.

We, including residents, seasonal employees, visitors, etc., have six brick + mortar restaurants on our road system open year round to the public. As I have explained, there is a growing demand for social gathering venues as Kodiak continues to welcome guests and visitors alike while continuing to grow and expand. Out of these six restaurants, there are four permit holders for restaurant beer & wine exclusively, with only three for current public use. I feel as though providing more will not only increase business opportunities in our town but also open the door to more creativity and city development, increasing revenue and generating more taxable income for the city of Kodiak and through the Alaska alcohol tax. Beyond business development and increased revenue, allowing more permits also gives people more local options and establishments to enjoy and use while hopefully providing more of a draw for our annual out-of-town visitors and workers. I, as much as a lot of residents, would love to see our small town grow, thrive, and expand. While providing additional services and establishments for Kodiak, more permits allow for more job opportunities, more food/eatery options, and additional revenue in both our community and for the City of Kodiak.

There are two cities in the State of Alaska that haven taken advantage of the Restaurant or Eating Place Licenses since the titles passing. Both Wasilla and Valdez have been granted a total of at least 25 additional REPL's. I am reaching out asking for the City of Kodiak to consider following this lead to petition adding more licenses with beer and wine to benefit our ever growing and hospitable community in hopes of generating more income, job opportunities, and establishments that the community can all enjoy.


 Resolution No. 2024-22, Protesting, Subject to Rescission, Renewal of Restaurant or Eating Place License No. 2611 for Sizzler Burger & Peking Restaurant

Deputy Mayor Stanford read Resolution No. 2024-22 by title. This resolution to protest the renewal of the subject Restaurant or Eating Place License (REPL) application is on the floor from the regular Council meeting of July 25, 2024. State Law gives local governing bodies like the City of Kodiak and Kodiak Island Borough the opportunity to protest the approval of an REPL application with clear and concise reason within 60 days of receipt of the notice. At the August 8th regular meeting, a motion was passed to postpone approval of the resolution for 60 days, well past the open protest period allowed under State Law and deadline for the ABC Board to accept the protest of the renewal of the license.

In addition, and since July 25th, the Finance Director worked with Sizzler Burger owners to review all supporting documentation and accepted amended sales tax returns from Sizzler Burger. The lack of these documents was the only legal basis for the renewal protest under city code. In the meeting packet was a letter to the business owner requesting supporting documentation, a June 11, 2024, letter from the Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office with the renewal application and a letter dated September 6, 2024, to the ABC Board from the Kodiak Island Borough requesting the ABC Board revoke the license held by Sizzler Burger.

Since procedurally, AMCO has crosed this action and the oo days to protest has come and gone, and the fact that the Finance Department has accepted amended sales tax returns and Kodiak
