Background: Consideration of the third and fourth waivers is requested for license 553. Information provided in the waiver of operations applications indicated that, the parking lot entrance to the premises location under went construction by State of Alaska DOT&PF to add a bike path along the Seward Highway. These changes affected the drain field for the property. Additionally, there was a break in at the property, the premises was vandalized and plumbing destroyed. These factors, including the licensee's health, have prevented the license from being operated.

Attachments: Memo, 4th Waiver Application for 2025, 3rd Waiver Application for 2024, 2nd Waiver Application for 2023 (approved administratively), 1st Waiver Application for 2022 (approved administratively), 2026-2027 Renewal Application Summary.

Applicable statute: AS 04.11.330(a)(3). An application requesting renewal of a license or endorsement shall be denied if the applicant has not operated the licensed premises for at least 240 hours during each of the two preceding calendar years, unless the board determines that the licensed premises are under construction or cannot be operated through no fault of the applicant;...

Applicable regulation: [3 AAC 305.120 Waiver of annual operating requirement and minimum operating requirements.](#) (a) Except as provided in this section, the board will deny an application for renewal of a license or a license with one or more endorsements if the licensed premises were not operated for the time required under [AS 04.11.330\(a\)\(3\)](#) or (d).

(b) A licensee may submit a waiver application to the board to request a waiver of the operating requirement in [AS 04.11.330](#) (a)(3) or (d). Under [AS 04.11.330](#)(a)(3), the board will determine whether, through no fault of the licensee or because the premises are under construction, the licensed premises could not be operated for the required time during the preceding calendar year.

(c) A waiver application for a calendar year must be made in writing to the board and must be accompanied by the non-refundable application fee of (1) an amount equal to one-half the applicable biennial license fee if a waiver application was not made for the previous year; or (2) double the amount of the fee paid for the previous waiver application.

(d) A waiver application must include a statement from the licensee explaining why the licensed premises was not in compliance with [AS 04.11.330\(a\)\(3\)](#) or (d). The licensee must provide a copy of the waiver application to any local governing body with jurisdiction over the license and licensed premises.

(e) The board may deny a third or subsequent, consecutive application for waiver (1) unless the licensee clearly shows that the licensed premises were not operated, because the premises were condemned or substantially destroyed by any cause; ...

(f) Absent circumstances to the contrary, the board will deny a third or subsequent, consecutive application for waiver in the event of condemnation or destruction of the premises if the premises identified on an applicant's license are not leased or owned by the licensee. Additionally, a third or subsequent consecutive application for waiver that does not identify a licensed premises location will be denied.

(g) The board may impose conditions along with the approval of a waiver application.

(h) If a waiver application is denied, an application for license renewal for the succeeding license period will be denied by the board under [AS 04.11.330\(a\)\(3\)](#).

(i) In addition to the application fee under (c) of this section, the applicant shall pay \$1,000 for an application that is received too late for board consideration at its last meeting of the calendar year for which the waiver is requested.

(j) In the event of the death of a licensee, destruction of the premises, or comparable circumstances showing extraordinary hardship, the board may waive the fees required under (c) and (i) of this section...

Provide an explanation as to why the licensed premises were not operated:

Attached are copies of the, "EXPLANATION for 2022 Form AB-29" filed with the 2022 AB 29, and a copy of the 2023 AB-29. These attachments discuss the history and reasons for shutting down and failure to reopen, which basically were caused by the state taking highway frontage land for a Bike path, and my health.

As of January, I have paid \$762, and received health permits, and have filed all monthly and quarterly tax reports with the Municipality. At the close of last year, plans by an engineer to reconstruct the drain field, were approved by State D.E.C. Also, to protect all the water lines, both inside and outside, my plumber drained all the pipes to ensure that the well, water lines, water heater and furnace would be safe from freezing. The building has been without water, sewer & heat since last October 2023.

Plans to reconstruct the drain field were approved by State D.E.C. in 2023. The plans were conceptual but not designed. However, the technology proposed was either not available or practical for construction in Alaska. Also, in April, the building was broken into. Areas of the Building were trashed and all the exposed copper heating and water lines in the furnace room cut and removed. It is not covered by insurance and was reported. The State police no longer patrol the Highway. The APD has been investigating since April. My son in law found out who broke in and reported it. We haven't heard back from the police.

In 2019 the State settled the cost of the Right of Way Acquisition. It was based on 2019 costs and the false premise that the property could be restored (see previous explanations). That was five years ago and as we know, costs have changed. I went to my Bank; they suggested I apply for a commercial state loan after my 2024/25 license is approved.

On a positive side, my near fatal affliction in 2022 has been upgraded to being an old coot. I can still walk, vote and count to ten, have 20-20 vision and fill out this form. Barring any accident, I'll be around for a while. The Indian House is a part of Alaska History and I want it to continue to exist.

I respectfully request approval of this Waiver.

Dear Agents and Board Members:

2020 and 2021: This year, when I filed the 2022/23 License Renewal Application (Form AB-17), I included forms AB-30 (Proof of Minimum Operation) for 2020 and an AB 29 (Waiver of Operation) for 2021. The primary reasons for our closure in 2020, were Government ordered shutdowns for the Covid pandemic and the acquisition of my property frontage by the State of Alaska. The right-of-way acquisition was for the purpose of constructing a bike-foot-path on the north side of the Seward Highway. The Indian House property acquired and removed affected: the historic Indian House sign; a parking lot entrance; our roadway and parking lot lighting; and the 120-foot long, iron sanitary sewer drain field tank (the size of 2 transit buses). The drain field tank is mandatory for commercial dining operations.

The reason we could not open in 2021 was a failure to secure a workable, commercial drain field permit from the State of Alaska D.E.C. (Department of Environmental Quality). This was caused by communication difficulties, caused in part by the Covid pandemic, and the national Covid circumstances that made manufactured components and construction more difficult and expensive. It was also caused by the landscape of the property with the lot's hillside and the creeks, adjacent to the Indian House. The hill and the creeks cause excessive requirements by the State D.E.C. and makes replacing the water and sewer system very difficult (photo attached). In the summer of 2021, the existing drain field was removed by the State and we were unable to open.

As I stated in the 2021 Form AB-29 * Waiver of Operation Application, after numerous attempts, a new contractor enlisted another engineer to acquire a workable permit. After months of discussion, last year, in November 2021, the engineer and the State DEC arrived at a tentative conceptual agreement (attached). The estimated costs did not include designs, any delivery cost, construction costs and any other costs included for the facilities that were affected by the right of way take. The revised proposal would substantially increase the 2019 cost estimates, and I would have to borrow more money to proceed. Because the difference between constructing a commercial and residential drain field is an estimated \$175,000, and because the Indian House cannot be in business without the liquor license, I put the design and construction on hold until the license renewal was approved.

2022: The House was still closed when I filed the renewal application this year. On February 15 and May 9, I received Temporary Extensions to the license. On May 20, I was sent an EMAIL from the ABC staff requesting further information. I responded on May 31 with the information and was notified that day, that the application was accepted and scheduled to go before the Board on June 28.

During that last week in May when I was responding with additional information, my wife was in bed with a bad case of Covid. Then, in the first week of June, I tested positive for Covid and was hospitalized. When I was released from the hospital, I visited my family doctor and within a week I was back in the hospital because of low oxygen levels. When I was released again, they sent me home with an oxygen machine and subscriptions. Once again, I consulted with my doctor for continuing problems, and he found out that I acquired two infections that I got in the hospital. He prescribed that I return to the hospital for treatment. On June 27 (the day before the Board meeting), I again checked into the hospital. That time, I spent 11 weeks in the Hospital and one week in a recovery home, and to the surprise of at least one doctor, returned home on September 12. What a terrible summer! I had a lot of people praying for me and reading my Will. When I received an Insurance statement, as of October 12, my Insurance Company was billed \$499,529.55. I'm still waiting to find out how much they didn't pay.

It took me about a month to catch up on my bills, business and personal life, and I was seeing medical specialists for physical ailments I obtained in the hospital. Since my release I have seen four doctors a total of 10 times, and had three lab tests. I have been BODY X-RAYED, SONIGRAMED and had my HEART PHOTOGRAPHED from the inside. Next week I am seeing the Vascular Surgeon for an operation on my vascular system December 1st. After I recover, (positive thinking) my intention is to proceed with the Indian House future. If my outcome is negative, I'll be a memory and my son Carl G Sollenberger will be in charge of the Indian House.

TO DATE: I would like to complement the ABC staff and express my appreciation for their cooperation and advice I have received concerning my applications. Until I contacted the staff on October 11, I didn't know the status of the license approval. In summary, the reason we did not open in 2022 was that I was too feeble deal with permitting and constructing a new drainage field. As I stated, I am returning to the hospital in December and upon advice of the ABC staff I am filing this FORM AB-29 for the November 2022 meeting. As I previously stated, without the dispensary license, the Indian House will be out of business, and closed forever.



Provide an explanation as to why the licensed premises were not operated:

Attached is a copy of the, "EXPLANATION for 2022 Form AB-29" "filed with the 2022 AB 29, explaining the cause of the initial shut down and closure in 2022. In summary, the State removed my massive drain field for right of way and didn't issue a workable permit to replace it. Also, as explained, I was hospitalized last year.

In anticipation of opening this year, I paid the Municipality \$900 in health permits and filed all monthly and quarterly tax reports. I anticipate paying my 2024 health permits next month. This year, I have been disabled and am limited in my ability to go out. Last October 23, I had surgery and will have to more surgeries in December. The good news is I anticipate a Happy New Year.

Aside from my health limitations, the plans to reconstruct the drain field, approved by State D.E.C., were conceptual and for vary reasons not finalized. Subsequently, we missed the construction season. I am looking for another contractor or engineer for a better design, and I anticipate a need for additional financing.

I respectfully request approval of this waiver.

Attached is summary information explaining the operation and closures of the Indian House in 2021 and 2022. Briefly, the Indian House was closed starting 2020 because of the Covid government shut downs. Also in 2019 the State acquired 44 feet of right of way, which included the removal of a massive drain field. Because of the Covid crisis and the configuration of the Indian House property, we failed to obtain a State D.E.C. workable permit to construct another drain field in 2021. Although the public Covid caused the initial shut down, last June 3 I contracted Covid and spent all summer in hospitals. I am still receiving medical care and am scheduled to reenter the hospital next month. Because of my illness, I was unable to complete the permit acquisition and construction and we could not open in 2022. Please refer to the attached explanation.



Dear Agents and Board Members:

2020 and 2021: This year, when I filed the 2022/23 License Renewal Application (Form AB-17), I included forms AB-30 (Proof of Minimum Operation) for 2020 and an AB 29 (Waiver of Operation) for 2021. The primary reasons for our closure in 2020, were Government ordered shutdowns for the Covid pandemic and the acquisition of my property frontage by the State of Alaska. The right-of-way acquisition was for the purpose of constructing a bike-foot-path on the north side of the Seward Highway. The Indian House property acquired and removed affected: the historic Indian House sign; a parking lot entrance; our roadway and parking lot lighting; and the 120-foot long, iron sanitary sewer drain field tank (the size of 2 transit buses). The drain field tank is mandatory for commercial dining operations.

The reason we could not open in 2021 was a failure to secure a **workable, commercial drain field permit** from the State of Alaska D.E.C. (Department of Environmental Quality). This was caused by communication difficulties, caused in part by the Covid pandemic, and the national Covid circumstances that made manufactured components and construction more difficult and expensive. It was also caused by the landscape of the property with the lot's hillside and the creeks, adjacent to the Indian House. The hill and the creeks cause excessive requirements by the State D.E.C. and makes replacing the water and sewer system very difficult (photo attached). In the summer of 2021, the existing drain field was removed by the State and we were unable to open.

As I stated in the **2021 Form AB-29 * Waiver of Operation Application**, after numerous attempts, a new contractor enlisted another engineer to acquire a workable permit. After months of discussion, last year, in November 2021, the engineer and the State DEC arrived at a tentative **conceptual agreement** (attached). The estimated costs did not include designs, any delivery cost, construction costs and any other costs included for the facilities that were affected by the right of way take. The revised proposal would substantially increase the 2019 cost estimates, and I would have to borrow more money to proceed. Because the difference between constructing a commercial and residential drain field is an estimated \$175,000, and because the Indian House cannot be in business without the liquor license, I put the design and construction on hold until the license renewal was approved.

2022: The House was still closed when I filed the renewal application this year. On February 15 and May 9, I received Temporary Extensions to the license. On May 20, I was sent an EMAIL from the ABC staff requesting further information. I responded on May 31 with the information and was notified that day, that the application was accepted and scheduled to go before the Board on June 28.

During that last week in May when I was responding with additional information, my wife *was in bed with a bad case of Covid*. Then, in the first week of June, I tested positive for Covid and *was hospitalized*. When I was released from the hospital, I visited my family doctor and within a week I *was back in the hospital* because of low oxygen levels. When I was released again, they sent me home with an oxygen machine and subscriptions. Once again, I consulted with my doctor for continuing problems, and he found out that I acquired two infections that I *got in the hospital*. He prescribed that I *return to the hospital* for treatment. On June 27 (the day before the Board meeting), I again *checked into the hospital*. That time, I spent 11 weeks in the Hospital and one week in a recovery home, and to the surprise of at least one doctor, returned home on September 12. *What a terrible summer!* I had a lot of people praying for me and reading my Will. When I received an Insurance statement, as of October 12, my Insurance Company was billed \$499,529.55. I'm still waiting to find out how much they didn't pay.

It took me about a month to catch up on my bills, business and personal life, and I was seeing medical specialists for physical ailments I obtained in the hospital. Since my release I have seen four doctors a total of 10 times, and had three lab tests. I have been BODY X-RAYED, SONIGRAMED and had my HEART PHOTOGRAPHED from the inside. Next week I am seeing the Vascular Surgeon for an operation on my vascular system December 1st. After I recover, (positive thinking) my intention is to proceed with the Indian House future. If my outcome is negative, I'll be a memory and my son Carl G Sollenberger will be in charge of the Indian House.


TO DATE: I would like to complement the ABC staff and express my appreciation for their cooperation and advice I have received concerning my applications. Until I contacted the staff on October 11, I didn't know the status of the license approval. In summary, the reason we did not open in 2022 was that I was too feeble deal with permitting and constructing a new drainage field. As I stated, I am returning to the hospital in December and upon advice of the ABC staff I am filing this FORM AB-29 for the November 2022 meeting. As I previously stated, without the dispensary license, the Indian House will be out of business, and closed forever.



The Indian House is a Tourist attraction. The Indian House features a breathtaking view of the Turnagain Arm, where you can see the whales run and watch the Bore Tides. The view includes the community of Hope in the Resurrection Creek Valley, Sunrise Mountain and the 20-mile creek valley (where Sunrise Community once existed). We provide binoculars for guests to see Hope, the whales, and the dall sheep that have on the mountain behind the building. The view described is on north shore of the Kenai Peninsula, and is where Captain Cook, in 1776 turned back because it did not lead to the Northwest Passage. Also the area was rich with tales of gold mining and railroad construction in the turn of the last century. We are extremely proud of our view. The house and the view is designed to be family friendly. This attracts both tourists and Alaskans. In addition, Anchorage area residents bring their visiting guests to experience this scenic, historic part of Alaska, or use it as a destination when they just want to get out of town. Besides the view, the House has historic photos, some artifacts, and coin collections left by tourists in the last century. The inside is quite picturesque and Museum like. In general, people take pictures outside from the deck and of the inside of the building.

The Indian House building is sided with rustic logs from the Turnagain area. The ceiling and walls in the front area of the building is constructed with wooden slats and boards milled in the Bird Creek Sawmill in the last century. A wall divides the lounge and restaurant so that the restaurant area can be more family oriented. Dining is available in both areas. Also, the front of the building has a very large deck. The facility has three restrooms, which includes a handicap restroom. There are eight picture windows in the restaurant/lounge area that are vintage Alaska Railroad passenger car windows. There is also a small, alcohol free, outside dining/picnic area.
