

SB 22-205 Intoxicating Hemp And Tetrahydrocannabinol Products Task Force Announcement

INTERIM MEETINGS AND SEPTEMBER 7, 2022 MEETING NOTICE

To All Interested Parties:

The Department of Revenue State Licensing Authority (CDOR), in coordination with the Colorado Department of (CDA) and Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE), convened the SB 22-205 Task Force to collaborate on a report to the General Assembly concerning intoxicating hemp products. Specifically, SB 22-205 requires the Task Force to study intoxicating hemp products, make legislative and rule recommendations, and analyze the effectiveness of each recommendation. The Task Force is required to submit a report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly on or before January 1, 2023.

INTERIM MEETINGS ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Revenue, Department of Public Health and Environment, and Department of Agriculture (Departments) are offering the below date(s) and time(s) for the purposes of interim meetings to discuss more narrowly defined topics relevant to the SB 22-205 Task Force Report. These meetings are open to the public and interested parties may submit materials to inform the discussion among Task Force members and other interested parties. Additionally, we acknowledge some Task Force members may not be able to participate in these small group sessions. These meetings will be recorded and published on the SB22-205 Task Force Webpage and there will be report-outs at the beginning of the next regularly scheduled Task Force meeting on September 7, 2022.

inform Task Force recommendations

The Departments have prepared a draft outline for Task Force members to review and consider during this discussion, and which flags certain topics or questions that the Task Force will need to prioritize based on group discussions and potential recommendations.

Interim Meeting 2: Synthetic & Semi-Synthetic Cannabinoids Discussion

Meeting: Tuesday, August 23, 3033 2:00-4:00 pm (Zoom)

Discussion Topic: Task Force members will discuss and either solidify consensus or

counter-arguments regarding the following questions:

- 1) Whether synthetic cannabinoids should be permitted in Colorado;
- 2) Whether semi-synthetic cannabinoids should be permitted in Colorado;
- 3) How are these products defined or categorized
- 4) Which agency should be responsible for regulation and enforcement; and
- 5) If there are any other considerations (such as additional regulations and standards for compliance).

Additional Information

At this point, the Departments are seeking to initiate a discussion on 1) *semi-synthetic* cannabinoids (cannabinoids that are chemically converted from one type of extracted cannabinoid to another cannabinoid) and 2) *synthetic* cannabinoids (cannabinoids that are created through manufacturing processes from starting materials other than cannabinoids extracted from cannabis, whether such cannabinoid may or may not be found naturally in the cannabis plant).

Additional questions the Task Force may consider as part of this discussion include:

- What are the risks or public health concerns related to synthetic and semi-synthetic cannabinoids?
- Should the chemical modification of cannabinoids be permitted? What types of guardrails would need to be set in statute or rule if chemical modification is permitted?
- Should the manufacture of synthetic cannabinoids be permitted? What types of guardrails may need to be set in statute or rule if manufacture of synthetic cannabinoids is permitted?
