Describe the type of locked, safe, and secure storage compartments that will be used in any vehicles transporting marijuana or marijuana product:

1. The transportation of marijuana to testing, manufacturing, or retail establishments will be performed by the licensee using his vehicle or by a security contractor (Valkyrie Security) utilizing armored vehicle.
2. The marijuana will be secured in a locked metal compartment which is located inside the vehicle and is bolted to the vehicle chassis. The metal compartment is made of heavy gauge steel. The compartment doors have a heavy-duty hasp which will be fitted with a padlock.
3. The marijuana in the locked containers will be held by the transporter at all times until delivery at the receiving licensed facility.
4. The marijuana will be removed from the locked containers while in the presence of an authorized person at the receiving licensed facility.

OPERATING AGREEMENT OF ALASKA RUSTIC, LLC

THIS OPERATING AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is entered into as of 4/15/16, 2016, by and between William Russell ("WR") and Cynthia Russell ("CR") (each a "Member," and collectively, the "Members"). The interest that each Member holds in the Company, including all economic interest and all rights under this Agreement and applicable law, shall be referred to as "Membership Interest."

1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 Formation and Name. The Company was formed on March 8, 2016, when Articles of Organization (the "Articles") were filed with the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development in accordance with and pursuant to the Alaska Revised Limited Liability Company Act (the "Act"). The name of the Company shall be Alaska Rustic, LLC.

1.2 Term. The Company shall have perpetual existence, unless it is dissolved and its affairs wound up pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

1.3 Purpose. The purpose of the company is to operate an establishment licensed under Title 3, Chapter 306 of the Alaska Administrative Code, and for any other lawful purpose. The Company shall have the power to do any and all lawful acts for the furtherance of the purposes of the Company and this Operating Agreement.

1.4 Principal Office. The principal office of the Company in the State of Alaska shall be located at 184 Ray Halla Lane, Bird Creek, Alaska 99540, or at any other place within the State of Alaska that the Manager selects. The Manager may, in the Manager's sole and absolute discretion, establish and maintain such other offices and additional places of business of the Company, either within or without the State of Alaska, as the Manager deems appropriate.

1.5 Registered Agent and Office. The street address of the initial registered office of the Company is 184 Ray Halla Lane, Bird Creek, Alaska 99540, and the Company's registered agent at such address shall be William Russell.

1.6 Tax Matters Member. The tax matters member ("Tax Matters Member") shall have all powers and responsibilities of a "tax matters partner" within the meaning of Internal Revenue Code Section 6231(a)(7), and shall act in any similar capacity under applicable Law. WR shall be the Tax Matters Member of the Company.

1.7 Rights of Creditors and Third Parties. This Agreement is entered into between the Company and the Members for the exclusive benefit of the Company and its Members. This Agreement is expressly not intended for the benefit of any creditor of the Company or any other person. Except and only to the extent provided by applicable statute, no such creditor or third party shall have any rights under this

Agreement or any agreement between the Company and the Members with respect to any contribution or otherwise.

1.8 Title to Property. Except as otherwise may be provided in this Agreement, the Company shall hold all Company property in the name of the Company and not in a Member's name. The Members' Membership Interests in the Company shall be personal property for all purposes.

1.9 Payments of Member Obligations. The Company's credit and assets shall be used solely for the benefit of the Company, and no asset of the Company shall be transferred or encumbered for or in payment of, or for purposes of guarantee of, an obligation of the Members unless otherwise provided in this Agreement.

2. CAPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS

2.1 Initial Capital Contribution. Upon execution of this Operating Agreement, each Member will or has contributed to the Company the types and amounts of initial capital contribution set forth in the attached Exhibit A, incorporated herein by reference.

2.2 Additional Capital Contributions. Upon the agreement of all of the Members, a Member may make an Additional Capital Contribution. The Membership Interests of the Members shall be adjusted to reflect any Additional Capital Contribution when it is made. No Member shall be required to contribute any additional capital to the Company and no Member shall have any personal liability for any Additional Capital Contribution to the Company unless expressly assumed in writing.

3. DISTRIBUTIONS

3.1 Distributions. The Members shall determine from time to time whether a distribution is to be made to the Members and the amount of any such distribution; provided, however, the Company shall retain sufficient funds to serve the Company's working capital needs.

3.2 Reimbursement. The Company shall reimburse Members for the reasonable and necessary costs incurred on behalf of the Company, including, at the request of a Member, the costs incurred in the organization of the Company.

4. MANAGEMENT

4.1 Management of the Company. The business and affairs of the Company shall be managed by the Manager. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Operating Agreement, the Manager shall have full and complete authority, power, and discretion to manage and control the business, affairs, and properties of the Company, to make all decisions regarding those matters, and to perform any and all other acts or activities customary or incident to the management of the Company's business. WR shall be the initial Manager of the Company.

4.2 Removal of Manager. The Members may remove the Manager and elect a new Manager in the event of the Manager's willful or intentional violation or reckless disregard of the Manager's duties to the Company. The determination of whether such events exist shall be made by those Members holding a majority of the Membership Interests then held by Members and shall be final, binding, and not reviewable unless the decision was based on a material mistake of fact or law or was arbitrary and capricious. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed, however, to limit the Manager's ability to voluntarily resign as Manager.

5. MEMBERS

5.1 Meetings. Meetings of the Members may be called by the Manager, or by Members holding a majority of the Membership Interests. The meetings shall be held at the principal place of business of the Company or as designated in the notice or waivers of notice of the meeting.

5.2 Notice. Notice of any meeting of the Members shall be given no fewer than two (2) days and no more than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the meeting. Notices shall be delivered in the manner set forth in Section 12.2 and shall specify the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called. The attendance of a Member at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Member attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

5.3 Quorum. The Members holding a majority of the Membership Interests, present in person or represented by proxy, shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business at any meeting of the Members, provided that if the holders of less than a majority of the Membership Interests are present at said meeting, the holders then present may adjourn the meeting at any future time without further notice.

5.4 Manner of Acting. The act of the Members holding a majority of the outstanding Membership Interests shall be the act of the Members, unless the act of a greater number is required by statute, this Operating Agreement, or the Articles.

5.5 Action Without Meeting. Any action required to be taken at a meeting of the Members or any other action which may be taken at a meeting of the Members, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action so taken, shall be signed by the Members having not less than the minimum number of votes that would be necessary to authorize or take such action at a meeting at which the Members were present and voting. Prompt notice of the taking of the action without a meeting by less than unanimous consent shall be given in writing to those Members who were entitled to vote but did not consent in writing.

5.6 Telephonic Meetings. The Members may participate in and act at any meeting of Members through the use of a conference telephone or other communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other. Participation in such meeting shall constitute attendance and

presence in person at the meeting of the Person or Persons so participating. Copies of all written materials that are to be considered at the meeting shall be provided to all members participating by telephone.

5.7 Proxies. Each Member entitled to vote at a meeting of Members, or to express consent or dissent to action in writing without a meeting, may authorize another Person or Persons to act for such Member by written proxy. Such proxy shall be deposited at the principal offices of the Company not less than forty-eight (48) hours before a meeting is held or action is taken, but no proxy shall be valid after eleven (11) months from the date of its execution, unless otherwise provided in the proxy.

5.8 Voting of Interests. Each Member shall be entitled to vote according to the Member's Membership Interest in the Company upon each matter submitted to a vote of the Members.

5.9 Personal Service. No Member shall be required to perform services for the Company solely by virtue of being a Member.

6. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Except as otherwise provided in the Act, the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the Company, whether arising in contract, tort, or otherwise, shall be solely the debts, obligations, and liabilities of the Company, and the Members shall not be obligated personally for any such debt, obligation, or liability of the Company solely by reason of being a Member. The failure of the Company to observe any formalities or requirements relating to the exercise of its powers or management of its business or affairs under the Act or this Operating Agreement shall not be grounds for imposing personal liability on a Member for liabilities of the Company.

7. INDEMNIFICATION

The Company shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless any person who is a Member, to the fullest extent allowed by the Act, from and against any and all losses, claims, demands, costs, damages, liabilities (joint or several), expenses of any nature (including attorneys' fees and disbursements), judgments, fines, settlements, and other amounts arising from any and all claims, demands, actions, suits, or proceedings, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative, in which a Member may be involved or threatened to be involved, as a party or otherwise, arising out of or incidental to the business or activities of or relating to the Company, regardless of whether such Member continues to be a member of the Company at the time any such liability or expense is paid or incurred; provided that such Member's actions did not constitute fraud, intentional misconduct, bad faith, gross negligence, or a knowing violation of law, or actions from which such Member personally received a benefit in money, property, or services to which such Member was not legally entitled. All expenses (including attorneys' fees), costs, judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement of any action, suit or proceeding shall be paid by the Company as they are incurred by the Member who is entitled to indemnification in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit,

or proceeding. The provisions of this Article do not affect any rights to advancement of expenses to which a Member may be entitled under any contract or otherwise by law.

8. TRANSFER OF MEMBERSHIP INTERESTS AND THE ADDITION, SUBSTITUTION, AND WITHDRAWAL OF MEMBERS

8.1 Definition of Transfer. The term "transfer," when used in this Section 8 with respect to a Membership Interest, shall include any sale, assignment, gift, pledge, hypothecation, mortgage, exchange, or other disposition. However, a "transfer" shall not include any pledge, mortgage, or hypothecation of or granting of a security interest in a Membership Interest in connection with any financing obtained on behalf of the Company.

8.2 Void Transfers. No Membership Interest shall be transferred, in whole or in part, except in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Section 8. Any transfer or purported transfer of any Membership Interest not made in accordance with this Section 8 shall be void ab initio.

8.3 Restrictions of Transfers.

8.3.1 Consent Required. No Member may transfer all or any portion of or any interest or rights in his or her Membership Interest or his or her capital account without the express written consent of the Members then holding a majority of Membership Interests. Each Member acknowledges the reasonableness of this prohibition in view of the relationship of the Members.

8.3.2 Substitution. Any transferee of a Membership Interest shall become a substituted Member upon (i) the express written consent of the non-transferring Members then holding a majority of non-transferring Membership Interests; (ii) the transferee agreeing to be bound by all the terms and conditions of the Articles and this Operating Agreement; and (iii) receipt of any necessary regulatory approvals. Unless and until a transferee is admitted as a substituted Member, the transferee shall have no right to exercise any of the powers, rights, and privileges of a Member hereunder. A Member who has transferred his or her Membership Interest shall cease to be a Member upon transfer of the Member's entire Membership Interest and thereafter shall have no further powers, rights, and privileges as a Member hereunder except as provided in Section 7.

8.3.3 Dealing with Members. The Company, the Manager, each Member, and any other person or persons having business with the Company need deal only with Members who are admitted as Members or as substituted Members of the Company, and they shall not be required to deal with any other person by reason of transfer by a Member, except as otherwise provided in this Operating Agreement. In the absence of the substitution (as provided herein) of a Member for a transferring Member, any payment to the transferring Member or to the transferring Member's successors or assigns shall acquit the Company of all liability to any other persons who may be interested in such payment by reason of an assignment by the transferring Member.

8.3.4 No Right to Withdraw. No Member shall have any right to resign or otherwise withdraw from the Company without the express written consent of all the other Members.

9. DEATH

Upon the death of any Member, the Membership Interest of the deceased Member ("Estate Interest") shall pass to the remaining Members, in proportion to the remaining Members' existing Membership Interests.

10. DISSOLUTION

The Company shall dissolve and commence winding up and liquidating upon the determination of the Members to dissolve. At the time of the dissolution and winding up of the Company, following the payment of all Company obligations, the remaining assets shall be distributed to the Members in proportion to the Members' Membership Interests at the time of dissolution. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if a Member has a deficit capital account balance, such Member shall have no obligation to make any contribution to the capital of the Company with respect to such deficit, and such deficit shall not be considered a debt owed to the Company or to any other person or entity for any purpose whatsoever.

11. FINANCIAL RECORDS AND BANKING

The Company's books shall be maintained at its principal place of business or at such other location as the Members designate. The books shall be kept on a calendar year basis and shall be closed and balanced at the end of each year. The Company shall maintain its own separate bank accounts and shall not commingle its funds with those of its Members. The Manager is authorized individually to open the Company accounts with the Manager's bank or banks of choice, using the standard form of banking resolution of each such bank.

12. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

12.1 Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Alaska. Venue and jurisdiction shall lie exclusively in Anchorage, Alaska.

12.2 Notice. Any notice required hereunder shall be in writing and shall be effective when actually delivered at the address shown below or at such other address as that party may have designated by written notice received by the other parties to this Operating Agreement.

The rights and remedies provided by this Agreement are cumulative and the use of any one right or remedy shall not preclude or waive the right to use any or all other remedies. Said rights and remedies are given in addition to any other rights the parties may have by law, statute, ordinance, or otherwise.



- (1) Ultra-Electronics 30 MIL CR80 Access security cards will be issued to marijuana establishment licensee or authorized employee, and to law enforcement personnel including an agent of the board. Allowing for limited access to restricted areas. All other personnel will be issued a non-technological badge limiting their access to restricted access areas.
- (2) Visitors will be admitted into the premises in accordance with 3 AAC 306.710(c). All visitors will be required to provide a valid photo identification as outlined by 3 AAC 306.350 to assess age and ability to enter the premises and includes; an unexpired, unaltered passport, an unexpired, unaltered drivers license; instruction permit, or identification card of any state or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia or a province of Canada or an identification card issued by a federal or state agency authorized to issue a driver's license or identification card. If any of the documentation appears to be fraudulent, is not valid or appears suspicious, the individual will be asked to leave the premises and will not be allowed to enter the facility or secure side yard.

Visitors to the premises will be supervised at all times by an authorized employee and no more than five (5) visitors will be allowed per each employee at a time (3 AAC 306.710 (b)). All visitors will be required to sign non-disclosure agreements, visitor agreement and will be stored in the visitor record with the following information per 3 AAC 306.755(6); name, date, time in and out, copy of identification and signature of supervising employee. Visitors will include; Marijuana Control Board staff and/or Directors, Peace Officers, Law enforcement personnel, Landlord (as applicable), contracted service personnel,

Visitor Agreement: Visitors will be given instructions regarding not touching plants/products or entering in any area that the supervising employee has not designated as a visiting area. Visitors will not be allowed to take pictures of the facility unless authorized by management and will sign an agreement attesting to the above information.

Visitors will abide by all sanitation requirements including; entry procedures (i.e. antibacterial procedures, changing into provided coats, footwear, and caps as applicable), exit procedures (i.e. entering changing room, removing provided sanitary clothing, gathering items and immediately exiting the building) and informing company of any illnesses that could affect the sanitation of the overall cultivation facility as applicable to 3 AAC 306.440.

Visitor passes will be provided to individuals over the age of 21 (with valid identification) accessing the building due to marijuana related business. Marijuana establishments delivering or picking up marijuana will be required to provide a valid marijuana handlers card, their marijuana establishments identification badge, will receive a visitors pass and will be escorted by authorized personnel at all times. 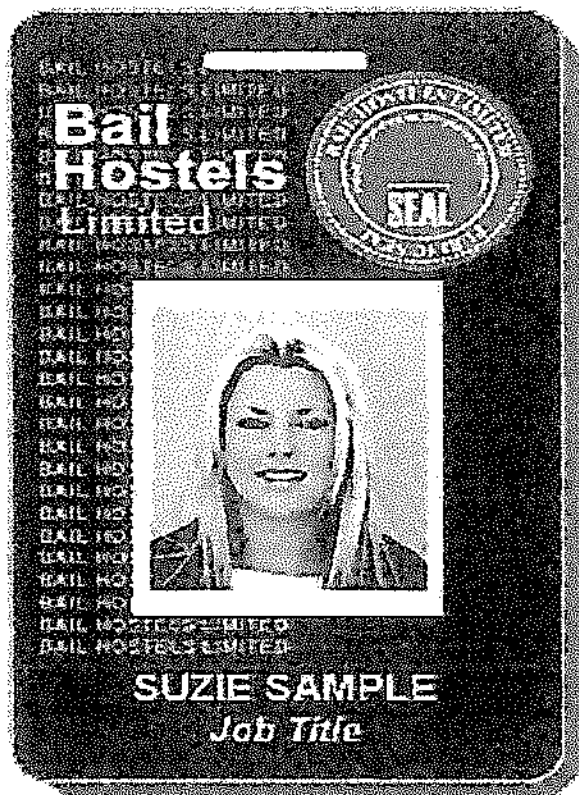

Alaska Rustic LLC. will ensure that each licensee, employee or agent who is required or permitted to be physically present on the licensed premises at any time per 3 AAC 306.425 and 3 AAC 306.700 will obtain a marijuana handlers card as provided in 3 AAC 306.700 before being present or employed at the cultivation facility's licensed premises and it must be in the person's immediate possession, or a valid copy on file on the premises at all times.

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Applicants will have a marijuana handler's card before accepting employment and Alaska Rustic LLC. will pay for the cost of renewal every three (3) years while the individual is employed.

During work hours employees will be required to carry an identification badge issued by Alaska Rustic LLC. that is visible and identifies the employee by name and picture 3 AAC 306.710(c). Employees are responsible for maintaining the security of their identification badges after hours by not leaving it visible to the public (i.e. vehicles) and are responsible for notifying management immediately if their badge or Marijuana Handlers Card is lost or stolen at which point management personnel will make a note in the employees file, issue a new card with provide a new employee identification number. Identification badges will be issued the first day of employment and will be issued to full-time part-time employees. Badge sample below:



Employees that fail to display their identification badge, marijuana handlers card or other required documents to company management, enforcement officers, peace officers and the Marijuana Control Board staff or Director may be grounds for termination or face disciplinary action. Alaska Rustic LLC. will utilize a progressive disciplinary action plan for minor incidences that do not require immediate termination. The disciplinary action plan consists of a verbal warning, written warning, corrective action or performance improvement plan and then termination if plan not followed or infractions continue to occur. Employees may be asked to show their identification badges to the above mentioned entities as well as will be used to enter restricted access areas and for identification in the case of an emergency. Employees are required to return badges on their last day of employment. Only authorized personnel and employees will have access to restricted access areas that apply directly to their work. Contracted workers (i.e. trimming services) will be required to obtain an identification badge before beginning work and must be turned in at the end of each work shift. Restricted access areas include cultivation rooms, curing rooms, security rooms, storage rooms, quarantine and point of sales and any others required. Only five (5) visitor passes will be issued at a time per employee and all visitors will be supervised at all times by the employee.

In order to further security for the premises and ensure we are abiding by strict security standards, only authorized employees (i.e. management, etc.) will have access to security system information including entrance keys and codes to arm and disarm the security system. Authorized employees will be provided entrance keys that state "do not duplicate", individual panic buttons and will be kept in a responsible and secure manner at all times within their possession. Security codes for entrance and arming/disarming the system will be unique to each employee ensuring that the identity of the person arming and disarming the alarm system is logged and tracked. Only authorized employees will have access to the locked and secure storage of the security equipment including video surveillance feeds, safe and secure business documents as per 3 AAC 306.720(d). All areas stated will have video surveillance feed in order to ensure higher security standards.

Security Alarm Systems and Lock Standards (3 AAC 306.715):

An alarm system is required for all license types. Describe the security alarm system for the proposed premises:

- (1) Pursuant to 3 AAC 306.715(c)(2) a security alarm system on all exterior doors and windows; and The Licensed Facility will have
 - a. The alarm system must be activated on all exterior doors and windows when the licensed premises is closed for business. Describe how the security alarm system meets this requirement:

- (1) The alarm system will be monitored by a third party agency. AlarmWATCH certifications include IQ Certified Central Station (One of first in nation), UL Certified Facility, UL Certified Operators, SIA Certified Operators, SIA Central Station Trained Instructors, APCO Certified Operators and -FARA and Federal UL 2050. Supporting Alarm Communications and Interactive Service from Every Major Manufacturer The list includes Connect 24, C24 Interactive, AlarmNET, AES, Uplink, DMP Internet, Tellular, Alarm.com. Based in Maryland with monitoring centers nationwide that are staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. During non-business hours monitoring of all devices (Motion Detectors, door contacts and GE Glass break detectors) within the system will be active and monitored. In the event of a security breach of the licensed premises an exterior as well as interior sounder will be activated immediately, an alarm signal will be received by the monitoring center who will notify security, local law enforcement and the licensee.

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Page 5,

Describe your policies and procedures for preventing diversion of marijuana or marijuana product:

Owners, employees, visitors and other individuals will be held to a zero tolerance policy on the diversion of marijuana (3 AAC 306.715(c)(1)). The electronic tracking system will be used to ensure diversion of marijuana does not occur throughout the normal processes of the cultivation facility. Marijuana will be entered into the system and tracked throughout the cultivation, packaging, testing, disposal and selling process. If the tracking system shows potential diversion of product authorized personnel will initiate an investigation that will include; talking to employees on shift, assessing last log in's to the system and product in question, notifying the Marijuana Control Board and reviewing video feed.

In addition to the above, authorized personnel will randomly check video feed for potential diversion (1x per week), will supervise all visitors and require them to remain in the building until law enforcement arrives. If diversion is suspected, restrict access to restricted areas where marijuana or cash are present as well as will provide information pertaining to the consequences of breaking the policy. Consequences include notifying law enforcement, immediate termination, visitor access removal and prosecution of crimes.

Describe your policies and procedures for preventing loitering:

- (1) Security and staff will perform routine but unscheduled patrols. Loiterers will be asked to leave when discovered and law enforcement will be called if continued loitering persists.
- (2) Alaska Rustic LLC. will operate under a "no loitering" policy that will limit individuals from standing or waiting without purpose on the premises as accordingly under 3 AAC 306.715(c)(2). During business hours employees will be provided training on the importance of limiting loitering and learn skills to verbally remove individuals from the premises. If individuals are unwilling to leave the premises or continue to loiter in the general area, law enforcement/peace officers will be notified and employees will follow the recommendations of law enforcement.

Employees will not engage in discussions with minors or other individuals outside the building about the marijuana establishment, around the establishment or to promote marijuana use to individuals under the age of 21 years. Employees will conduct random perimeter checks in order to address loitering issues in a timely manner. The exterior building will have "No Loitering" signs placed on the front of the building as well as on the front fence of the side yard. Loitering will be defined as; to stand or wait around idly or without apparent purpose.

Describe your policies and procedures regarding the use of any additional security device, such as a motion detector, pressure switch, and duress, panic, or hold-up alarm to enhance security of the proposed premises:

- (1) Motion detectors are utilized for afterhours monitoring of the licensed premises.

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- (2) Duress and panic switches are easily accessible to facilitate a response by public safety and security in an efficient manner and will be utilized by licensee, employees and agents during business hours. These devices are silent alarms and will be activated in the event of a security breach in progress such as robbery, or in the event of an assault on the premises.
- (3) All key pads will be programmed with a silent medical and fire duress option to alert medical personnel or fire fighters in the event of a medical emergency or fire.
- (4) Any use of the duress or panic buttons will notify the monitoring center by silent alarm, giving the appropriate agency information that a security breach is in progress and to use extreme caution when approaching.

Waste Management Plan for Alaska Rustic, LLC

As required under 3 AAC 306.730 all solid or liquid waste including wastewater generated during marijuana cultivation and production will be managed in compliance with applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations as follows:

Notifications

The operator will provide a minimum of 3 days advance notice to the Marijuana Control Board using the marijuana inventory tracking system under 3 AAC 306.730 before making the waste unusable and disposing of it and keep a record of the final destination of marijuana waste made unusable before disposing of it.

Agricultural Wastewater Runoff Water

Operator will use trays to catch run-off water and will use natural or enhanced evaporation to reduce water quantity. Excess water that results from indoor cultivation activities will be collected into plastic tote container for temporary indoor storage. This includes excess irrigation water that may discharge from cultivation beds or other miscellaneous water from a hand sink and a mop sink. The sink will be used exclusively for hand washing and the mop sink for cleaning of utensils and water spillage cleanup off the concrete floor.

Floor drains will lead to a containment sump and these collected waters will be pumped via sump pump to the storage container. The storage tank may be located inside or outside and will include a high liquid level alarm set at 85% tank capacity to alert the operator that reuse or disposal is required. The tank will also be equipped with an observation port for confirmation current liquid levels.

The subject operation uses no pesticides or herbicides and no chemical fertilizers. The collected runoff will be profiled (tested) for nutrient, salt content and pH and evaluated for beneficial reuse as appropriate. Due to the uniformity of the operation testing of the water may occur infrequently once the operation water parameters have been determined.

Excess collected water will be evaluated for on-site beneficial reuse as lawn and garden amendments in summer months. When weather conditions do not allow for beneficial reuse the contained liquids will be removed from the tank by Municipality approved septic pumper and transported to and discharged to the AWWU specified disposal manhole in accordance with AWWU requirements. Operator has confirmed this practice is appropriate directly with AWWU personnel. The subject wastewater is then treated via the Point Woronzof Public Owned Treatment Works (POTW). The Operator will retain a receipt or other documentation provided by the septage hauler in the facility waste management records

Water generated for beneficial reuse or disposed of as wastewater is estimated to range between 10 and 25 gallons per day.

Solid Waste Disposal Arrangements

Leaf trim and shake will be sold to an appropriately licensed facility and processed into concentrates if possible. If these items cannot be sold or if additional plant materials are generated or unused these will be made unusable by grinding the plant waste mixing it with at least an equal amount of other

compostable or non-compostable materials. In most cases the subject facility has an ample supply of sawdust to provide the mixing substrate. For offsite waste disposal the bagged mixed plant and organic material will be transported to the Anchorage Regional Landfill (ARL) for proper disposal as organic waste. The operator has confirmed with Municipality of Anchorage Solid Waste Service (SWS) personnel that the proposed disposal of organic waste is acceptable and consistent with SWS landfill management policies and practices. The ARL for the time being has requested that the waste delivery be noticed at the SWS waste acceptance kiosk as a matter of practice. The Operator will retain a receipt along with other records of disposal.

In some cases the Operator may elect to compost the ground plant materials with other organic compostable substances available (including sawdust and yard grass clippings) and retain such rendered material on site for beneficial use as lawn and garden amendments.

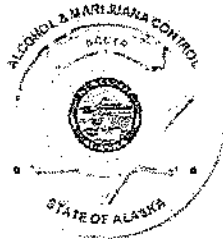

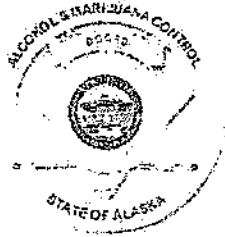

Describe the marijuana cultivation facility's growing medium(s) to be used:

1. The growth medium will consist of an artificial soil containing naturally-occurring organic materials including coco coir, processed manure, rice hulls, peat moss, compost, biochar, perlite, vermiculite, and lime. This medium and other artificial soils made of similar, naturally-occurring organic materials are sold commercially and would be obtained from a vendor.

3. Plants will be watered by hand and with a drip irrigation system consisting of plastic tubing connected to the water supply in the building. The irrigation system would be controlled by timer.
