This is a notice to you as licensee that an alleged violation has occurred. If the Marijuana Control Board decides to act against your license, under the provisions of AS 44.62.330 - AS 44.62.630 (Administrative Procedures Act) you will received an Accusation and Notice of your right to an Administrative Hearing.

Note: This is not an accusation or a criminal complaint.

**VIOLATION:** On October 17, 2016 AMCO Investigators observed discrepancies in METRC in regards to Rosie Creek's marijuana inventory. Thousands of outdoor plants in the fields were listed in flowering stages for an extended period of time despite there had been a significant frost and cold weather in the Fairbanks area on or around September 30, 2016. There was significant missing, inconsistent, and inaccurate information regarding harvested plants in the METRC system. The destroyed plants had not been documented in METRC, nor had the licensee contacted AMCO to make notification of such a significant loss of crop.

On October 26, 2016 AMCO Investigator Stonecipher conducted an on-site inspection. There were several thousand plants that had been harvested and left in a pile. According to Mike Emers they had been destroyed on or around September 30, 2016 and removed from the field on or around October 24, 2016. The plants still had not been entered as destroyed.

Mike Emers admitted some of his employees were entering information into METRC incorrectly at the beginning of the season. He opted to enter the information himself, but wanted to wait until the entire season was over; leaving a long lapse in data entry.

Dear Director Chambers,

My name is Michael Emers and I am the co-owner of RCFC, LLC dba Rosie Creek Farm (license # 10005). I am writing in response to the violation notice I received dated January 6<sup>th</sup>, 2017 and I would welcome a hearing with AMCO if one is required.

The information given in the violation notice is accurate as reported by officer Stonecipher. We were indeed delayed in entering data into Metrc which resulted in a delay in reporting to AMCO (through Metrc) when plants were actually destroyed making it seem as though plants were in a flowering phase much longer than actually happened. The fault was entirely ours in not alerting AMCO to the problem when it first occurred. What follows is an explanation of the circumstances.

Metrc was intended to be a simple method of entering data to track changes in the operation of our cultivation and harvest schedule. While this may be the case for an operation dealing with hundreds of plants, we found it became very difficult in an agricultural setting when keeping track of thousands of plants. We noticed this early in our season during the planting stage of our operation when we were planting thousands of plants per day just entering tag numbers. When we would go into Metrc in the afternoons or evenings to enter data, Metrc would both take a very long time to respond and crash often making it difficult to keep up to date. As we passed through the season into our harvest, entering both tag numbers and weights made the process very cumbersome to the point that we could no longer keep up. This was coupled with the fact that many mistakes were being made by our data entry person that were impossible to correct, resulting in the necessity of

issuing more tags to cover up our mistakes, costing us money. I made the decision to delay our harvest data entry into Metrc until after our seasonal crew left at the beginning of October. I should have alerted AMCO to our problems at this point and I did not. As it was, entering our harvest data into Metrc took me over a month to complete.

I completely understand the concerns brought about by our delay in entering our data and we did not have a concern about the AMCO officers reviewing our video footage to verify the gap between our last harvest and data entry. My main concern is that unless the process of data entry improves, we will run into similar problems next summer season when we are likely to triple the number of plants we will plant. I would welcome an opportunity to discuss the process with AMCO and troubleshoot solutions so that both the integrity of the tracking system is maintained and the ease of compliance for licensees improves. Metrc intended for us to take just a few minutes each day to complete. This is what we were told in our trainings with them. As explained above, we found this to be far from the case. One solution would be for Metrc to develop an Excel spreadsheet that could be uploaded into the tracking system. There also needs to be a section for "notes" so that explanations can be entered in real time.

I would welcome the opportunity to discuss this further if necessary.

### Ms. Franklin,

We had our initial inspections on 12-15-16 by Enforcement and the various city departments. We were given small lists of corrections by all departments to complete before our final inspections which were scheduled for today, 12-19-16. 12-16-16 we were unlocked in Metrc and at this time we believed we were within our rights to order product, which we did. We received this product at our facility 12-18-16. We were under the impression that this product would be reviewed by Enforcement during our final inspection. We made no attempt to hide or mislead the inspectors, the product was out in plain view in our secure store room. We followed all regulations for receiving the product. Also, we understood we were not to sell this product until final approvals were granted. Currently, all inspections are complete and we have been instructed by Enforcement to visit the City of Anchorage Admin. office tomorrow morning to collect our final license.

Our understanding of the proper sequence of events for these final stages was that we would have our first round of inspections, get unlocked in Metrc and have a final "product inspection", wherein Enforcement could come back to check off their final items and also make sure we had received our first product shipments correctly. As you may imagine, the last week and indeed the last few months have been extremely hectic. We have done everything possible to adhere to the regulations set forth by the state and will continue to do so. We did not willfully disregard the rules, this is a misunderstanding and a communication breakdown. We are one of the very first to work through this very complex process and would never intentionally do anything to endanger our position in the market. During our inspection this afternoon Enforcement admitted to me that we never should have been unlocked in Metrc. This was a mistake pure and simple. We were unlocked in Metrc, and acted in good faith and with all the information we had at the time.

Lastly, Dankorage takes full responsibility for this mistake and we are prepared to do whatever is necessary to correct it. Please let me know if you require anything further. Thank you very much for your consideration and we hope you have a happy holidays.

**VIOLATION:** On January 5, 2017 AMCO Investigators observed discrepancies in METRC in regards to Foxy Enterprise's marijuana inventory. Harvest batches from the same strain and plants were being divided into two separate harvest batches; one for bud and flower and the other for leaf and trim. According to METRC training, the harvest batches should include all material from the plant harvested. Testing should be done for every 5 pounds of product from the harvest batch. Once the testing passes, then the bud/flower and leaf/trim can be packaged for sale.

Due to the way Foxy Enterprises created two separate harvest batches for the same strain instead of one, it resulted in a potential health and safety hazard to the public. The strain "Hash" bud and flower failed testing. The "Hash" trim and leaf did not fail, even though they were from the same plants and harvests. This resulted in the testing facility locking the failed bud and flower but not the trim and leaf. An administrative hold had to be placed on the leaf and trim by AMCO Investigators to insure the product did not get sold to the public with possible contamination.
