

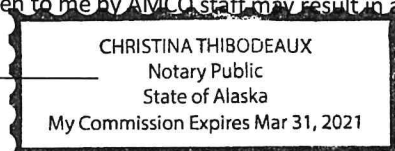

This is a notice to you as licensee that an alleged violation has occurred. If the Marijuana Control Board decides to act against your license, under the provisions of AS 44.62.330 - AS 44.62.630 (Administrative Procedures Act) you will receive an Accusation and Notice of your right to an Administrative Hearing.

Note: This is not an accusation or a criminal complaint.

On May 1 2018 at the AMCO office Shampayne Moore and Journey Malaikini were talking together about how many sales they had made at Raspberry Roots on April 30 2018. They were at the AMCO office to get their Marijuana Handler Permits and did not have handler permits on April 30. I spoke to Kim Kole, licensee for Raspberry Roots, on 5/2/18. She stated that she was training Shampayne and Journey on April 30. She stated that they had handled marijuana and made sales on the point of sales machine. This is in violation of 3AAC306.320 Marijuana Handler Permit Required.

3 AAC 306.805 provides that upon receipt of a Notice of Violation, a licensee may request to appear before the board and be heard regarding the Notice of Violation. The request must be made within ten days after receipt of the Notice. A licensee may respond, either orally or in writing, to the Notice. 3 AAC 306.810(3)(A)(B)(C) failed, within a reasonable time after receiving a notice of violation from the director, to correct any defect that is the subject of the notice of violation of AS 17.38 or this chapter, a condition or restriction imposed by the board or other applicable law.



I have an HR person who didn't realize how strict this policy is, so he hired them without cards, which started this issue. He had them do paperwork and watch training videos, in the employee break room area, so there were always people either sitting right there or popping back and forth. I discovered this situation when Shampayne was sitting in reception early in the shift and I asked her to put her Handler Card into the badge holder with her RR badge. That's when I learned she didn't have one. From then on, we had someone sitting with her in the waiting room during that shift and I had them sign in and out in the visitor's log and wear the additional visitor badge. On the 30th, when they were behind the counter, I was in and out of the facility, so I instructed all employees to ensure that they were shadowing and not left alone. However, I have not personally looked at the video to confirm or deny that they were ever left alone. I will say that it was a mistake that we will not make again! Lesson learned!

One final question. At any time, were these two employee's not supervised and in a restricted access area alone, even for a brief moment. I really would rather not pull three days' worth of video and look at it. I have a feeling James will want me to get it anyway.

to forward it to James, and I couldn't find it. I sent it to myself and time to make sure it goes through, and am now forwarding it to you. Please let me know if you can't open it for some reason. I think I've got the setting at "anyone with the link," but technology isn't always friendly given that it didn't even send last time. Jeff also asked me to include a narrative of our discussion when he came to talk to me a few days ago.

When Jeff arrived, he asked me if Journey and Shampayne were employed before they had their handler card. I said yes, but that it was over the weekend so they couldn't get a card. We were short staffed so I wanted to get them started training asap. I thought it would be ok if they signed into the visitor's log, wore both the visitor's badge and the Raspberry Roots badge, and were supervised as though they were any other visitor off the street. When I've visited facilities in other states, I was able to handle the plants and marijuana, so I didn't really think it would be different here since it doesn't say in the regs that visitors can't touch any product. One day they filled out paperwork and watched videos on cannabis and budtending. Another day they were supervised while acting as a receptionist in the waiting area. Here they only talked to customers and entered members into our system. On May 30th, I had both of them at the same time, only one of me, and no one else available to train, so I had them both budtending while I was watching and coaching. That is the attached video.

I am sorry for the misunderstanding. I read the regs pertaining to the visitor's badges to see if it would work if they were supervised, but I should have also read the employee section more carefully. I thought I had my bases covered with the visitor log and badges.
