First

LICENSE 20221 is in VIOLATION of the emergency regulation filed by Lieutenant Governor Byron Mallott on February 24, 2015, in AS 17.38.040,

"in public" means in a place to which the public or a substantial group of persons has access and includes highways, transportation facilities, schools, **places of amusement or business**, parks, playgrounds, prisons, and hallways, lobbies, and other portions of apartment houses and hotels not constituting rooms or apartments designed for actual residence. On November 20, 2015, the Marijuana Control Board amended to definition to exclude marijuana retail stores that have a consumption endorsement issued by the board. No such endorsements have yet been issued; therefore, it continues to be a violation of AS 17.38.040 to consume marijuana in a public place, including unlicensed, unregulated marijuana smoking clubs.

I propose THIS MARIJUNA LICENSE 20221 BE DENIED BASED ON THE EMERGENCY ORDER OF THE LT. GOVERNOR READ ABOVE-----the building being considered for this business is "IN PUBLIC":

- since it is the ONLY PUBLIC LAUNDRY MATT FACILITY in The Borough WHERE "THE PUBLIC" can wash OUR clothes in this immediate local area.

Secondly,

GRANTING LICENSE 20221 CREATES Limitation Violation LIABILTIES, AS AN ACT OF GOVERNMENT ENTRAPMENT, IF ISSUED BY THE ASSEMBLY

AS 17.38.010 made the use of marijuana legal only for persons 21 years of age or older.

A person 21 years of age or older may possess up to one ounce of marijuana for personal use

3 AAC 306.310. Acts prohibited at retail marijuana store

(a) A licensed retail marijuana store may not sell, give, distribute, deliver, or offer to sell, give, distribute, or deliver, marijuana or a marijuana product

(4) in a quantity exceeding the limit set out in 3 AAC 306.355; (One Ounce in possession).

During transport, the marijuana or marijuana product must be in a sealed package or container and in a locked, safe,

and secure storage compartment in the vehicle transporting the marijuana or marijuana product. The sealed package may not be opened during transport. 3AAC306.750

How will one store understand they have violated this section if located within proximity to another local retail operation. What then is the purpose of the "ONE OUNCE LIMIT" if it cannot be known that a customer has already purchased that amount during time frame indicated?

THEREFORE, IF THE DENALI BOROUGH ALLOWS ADDITIONAL LICENSING TO THE CURRENT CANYON LOCATION, THE GOVERNMENT COULD BE IN VIOLATIONS LIABILITY TO THE STATE OF ALASKA POSSESSION LIMITS CAUSING ENTRAPMENT SUITS AND VIOLATION OF STATE STATUTE FOR POSSESSION

SINCE, IT WOULD ALLOW AN INDIVIDUAL OPPORTUNITY TO PURCHASE UNREGULATED IN THE SAME 24 HOURS PERIOD EXCESS OF STATUTE LIMITS.

3 AAC 306.080. Denial of license application Requires Denial as stated below.

(a) After review of the application, including the applicant's proposed operating plan and all relevant information, the board will deny an application for a new license if the board finds that

(2) the license would violate any restriction in 3 AAC 306.010;

and

(6) the license would not be in the best interests of the public.

Local Options

3 AAC 306.200. Local options

(a) If a majority of the persons voting on the question vote to approve the option, or if a local government's assembly or city council passes an ordinance to the same effect, the local government shall adopt a local option to prohibit

- (1) the sale or importation for sale of marijuana and any marijuana product;
- (2) the operation of any marijuana establishment, including one or more of the following license or endorsement types:
 - (A) a retail marijuana store;
 - (B) a marijuana cultivation facility;
 - (C) a marijuana product manufacturing facility;
 - (D) a marijuana testing facility;
 - (E) an onsite consumption endorsement to a marijuana retail store license;
- (3) specific operational characteristics of an onsite consumption endorsement to a marijuana retail store license, including consumption by smoking or vaping, or outdoor consumption.

To the marijuana licensing review board,

I have received notifications for various dispensing and/or growing operations applications in the area close to my home on Evander Drive.

I object to any growing operations being installed and allowed to operate in any nearby area; specifically on King Street, and Schoon Street, between Dimond Blvd. and 76th Avenue. My objections are based on experience of a growing operation within a mile of a friend's home in Carpentaria, Ca. The odor was highly objectionable at this indoor location. Of course, the closer you drove to it, the worse it got. The operations were enclosed green houses and the folks working there all wore haz-mat suits and masks. The green houses were ventilated to the outdoors, primarily for the safety of the workers.

I personally have no objection to the controlled dispensing, but am vehemently opposed to any growing operation of any size. There is just no effective way to contain odor and these potential locations are in close proximity to neighborhoods. My home is within 1000 ft of the Schoon Street facility.

Is maternal marijuana use while breastfeeding child abuse?

AAP Fellows often send questions to the Committee on Medical Liability and Risk Management. While the committee is unable to give specific legal advice, it can give some general information that may be helpful. As always, it is important to recognize that laws vary state-to-state, and legal decisions depend on the facts at hand. It also is important to consult a qualified attorney for legal issues affecting your practice.

Q&A When a breastfeeding mom tells me she regularly smokes marijuana, do I have a legal obligation to report this as child neglect or abuse?

Data on the effect of cannabis metabolites in breast milk on an infant's health and development are insufficient. Therefore, the AAP does not consider a mother's marijuana use to be a contraindication for breastfeeding but advocates that all women who are breastfeeding abstain from using all cannabis products.

Pediatricians and other health care providers in all states are mandated to report suspected child abuse or neglect. The 2010 Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA) requires states to have policies and procedures to notify child protective services agencies of substance-exposed newborns and to establish a plan of safe care for newborns identified as being affected by illegal substance abuse or having withdrawal symptoms resulting from prenatal drug exposure (Child Welfare Information Gateway. 2016. *Parental drug use as child abuse*. Washington, D.C.: U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Children's Bureau).

Under federal law, marijuana is considered an illegal substance. Therefore, the CAPTA notification and safe plan of care requirements still apply in states where marijuana has been legalized for medical or recreational use.

However, it is important to note that states set their own definition of child abuse and neglect as it relates to reporting, so pediatricians may not be required to report marijuana use by breastfeeding mothers to the state or local child protective services. It is important to know your state's child abuse and neglect reporting requirements as well as CAPTA notification requirements.

The AAP clinical report *Marijuana Use During Pregnancy and Breastfeeding: Implications for Neonatal and Childhood Outcomes* <http://pediatrics.aappublications.org/content/142/3/e20181889>, recommends that all health care providers:

- Be aware of the specific reporting requirements of their state and the potential adverse legal and social consequences of identifying substance use in their patients.
- Emphasize that the purpose of screening is to allow treatment of the mother's substance use, not to punish or prosecute her.



States set their own definition of child abuse and neglect as it relates to reporting, so pediatricians may not be required to report marijuana use by breastfeeding mothers to the state or local child protective services.

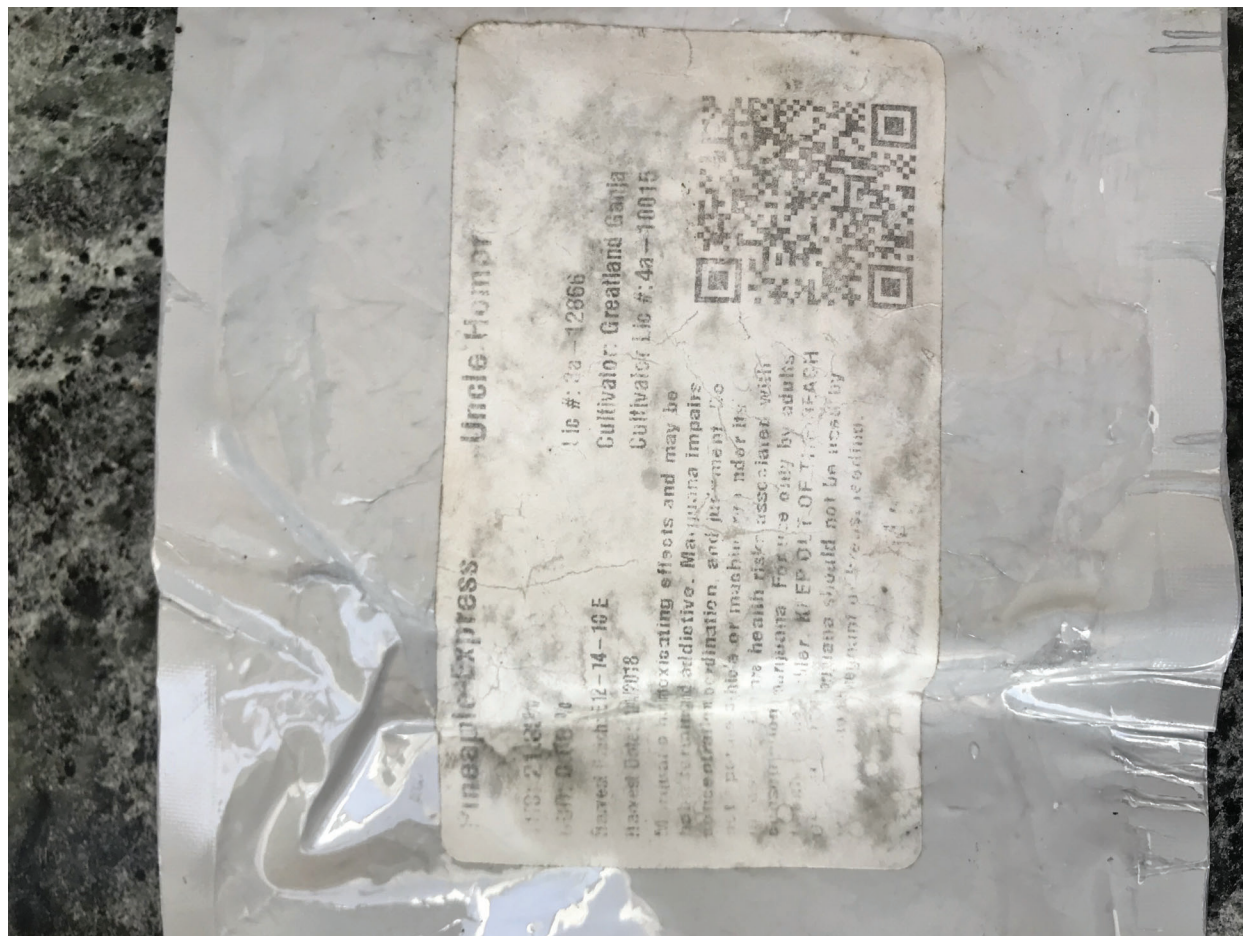
