Wheatley, Jr. (Mr. Wheatley), stipulate and agree to the following: BACKGROUND I. 21 DEPARTMENT OF COM On or about February 10, 1999, the division received an application for A. 22 an insurance producer license from Ms. Leydon to transact property and casualty lines of 23 24 insurance. She listed her employer as Montgomery & Collins Inc. of Alaska, which has 25 subsequently changed its name to American E & S Insurance Brokers of CA, Inc. Previously, 26 Ms. Leydon held insurance producer license no. 3254, which she canceled in August 1989.

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	B.	In that application Mr. Wheatley, as principal and compliance officer of
the firm, s	igned the	following statement: "By signature below, I certify that I understand that
am respor	sible for t	he actions of this applicant."

- C. Question 12(e) of the application asks "Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony in this or any other state or country, or pleaded no contest or nolo contendere to any indictment or complaint for a crime or offense, or received a suspended imposition of sentence and/or been placed on probation?" At the end of this question is the following sentence: "If you have answered "yes" to any of these questions, you must submit a notarized statement detailing: 1. date of occurrence; 2. the name and address of the court; and 3. the circumstances."
- D. Because Ms. Leydon answered "yes" to question 12(e) on the application, she submitted a notarized statement dated November 5, 1999. That statement revealed that she pled guilty and was convicted of one count of money laundering.
- E. The division obtained a copy of the Judgment in a Criminal Case,

 Memorandum of Sentencing Hearing and Report of Statement of Reasons, and other documents
 related to the conviction. The judgment, dated March 27, 1992, indicates that Ms. Leydon was
 convicted of money laundering under 18 U.S.C.§1957 (a)&2, which is a Class C felony. She
 was sentenced to 36 months probation with 240 hours of community service and ordered to pay
 a total of \$3,050 in fines and assessments. She has successfully completed her probation and
 fully paid all fines and assessments.

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	F.	Because Ms. Leydon's felony conviction was for a crime of dishonesty
under 18 U.	S.C. 10	33(e)(2) she is required to obtain the director's express consent to work in
the business	of insu	rance

- G. Ms. Leydon's felony conviction would be a basis to deny a license under AS 21.27.410(a)(7), and on June 29, 1999, the director issued a Statement of Issues to deny Ms. Leydon's application for an insurance producer license.
- H. Pursuant to AS 21.06.180, Ms. Leydon requested a hearing on the denial of licensure. She also requested the director's consent to work in the business of insurance, as required under 18 U.S.C. 1033(e)(2) and submitted information in support of her request.
- I. By letter dated August 24, 1999, for purposes of 18 U.S.C. 1033(e)(2), the director through his designee, Linda Brunette, granted interim conditional consent for Ms. Leydon to work at the insurance firm performing tasks not requiring a license until such time as the issues surrounding her license application were resolved.
- J. The director has fully reviewed Ms. Leydon's file, including the circumstances of her conviction and the proceedings of the imposition of sentence.

II. TERMS OF AGREEMENT

Under separate letter, the director will grant written consent allowing Ms.
 Leydon to engage in the business of insurance under 18 U.S.C. 1033(e)(2), which is conditioned on Ms. Leydon complying with the terms of this agreement, not violating the insurance code or regulations, and not committing any crimes in the future involving dishonesty or breach of trust or that otherwise bear on her trustworthiness or competency to hold an insurance license.

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	2.	Ms. Leydon, by signing this agreement, withdraws her request for
hearing da	ated July 1	9, 1999 and agrees that all matters that would have been addressed by such
a hearing	are resolve	ed by this agreement.

- The division will reactivate insurance producer license no. 3254 for Ms. 3. Leydon as an individual working in a firm subject to the following conditions:
- Within six months of the date the director signs the order approving this agreement, Ms. Leydon will successfully complete a course in professional ethics in insurance that has been approved in advance by the director or his designee and provide proof of that completion to the division.
- Ms. Leydon will submit to the division quarterly sworn b. statements indicating that she has complied with the insurance code and applicable regulations. The statements should be in a form similar to the attached Exhibit A and must also be signed under oath by her supervisor, Mr. Wheatley, or his successor as principal/compliance officer of the firm. If a new principal/compliance officer replaces Mr. Wheatley, Ms. Leydon agrees to provide the director with a letter from the new person agreeing to assume the obligations of the principal/compliance officer under this agreement. These conditions will remain in effect for five years from the date the division reactivates Ms. Leydon's license. During that period of time, Ms. Leydon will report directly to Mr. Wheatley or his successor.
- Ms. Leydon may not be licensed as an individual producer or as a principal or compliance officer of an insurance firm for a period of five years from the reactivation of her license. At the end of the five-year period, Ms. Leydon may apply to the division for an insurance license that gives her the authority to handle premium trust funds,

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subject to certain conditions and reporting requirements to be established by the division, including, but not limited to, providing to the division for approval a plan of operation to ensure compliance with the insurance statutes and regulations, a description of internal accounting procedures including premium trust account procedures and regular financial reporting regarding the status of the premium trust account. The parties understand that this agreement may be amended to enumerate such new conditions and reporting requirements.

- d. Should Ms. Leydon plan to change her place of employment at any time within five years from the reactivation of her license, she must provide each new employer with a copy of this agreement, and she must first provide the director with a letter from the compliance officer of her new employer agreeing to assume the obligations of the principal/compliance officer under this agreement.
- e. In addition to the notice requirement of AS 21.27.025, Ms.
 Leydon will immediately notify the director of any criminal investigation involving her, of which she is aware, or any criminal charges that have been filed against her.
- 4. By signing this agreement, Ms. Leydon and Mr. Wheatley understand and agree that any failure to comply with the terms of this agreement may be grounds to revoke, suspend, or non-renew Ms. Leydon's Alaska insurance license.

STATEMENT OF ISSUES

Marianne K. Burke, Director, Division of Insurance (division), Department of Commerce and Economic Development, State of Alaska, states:

- On or about February 10, 1999, the division received an application for an insurance producer license from Roseanne M. Leydon (Leydon) to transact property and casualty lines of insurance. Her employer is Montgomery & Collins Inc. of Alaska.
- Question 12(e) of the application asks "Have you ever been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony in this or any other state or country, or pleaded no contest or nolo contendere to any indictment or complaint for a crime or offense, or received a suspended imposition of sentence and/or been placed on probation?" At the end of this question is the following sentence: "If you have answered "yes" to any of these questions, you must submit a notarized statement detailing: 1. date of occurrence; 2. the name and address of the court; and 3. the circumstances."

- 4. In conducting a routine investigation, a division investigator obtained a copy of the Judgment in a Criminal Case, Memorandum of Sentencing Hearing and Report of Statement of Reasons, and other documents related to the conviction. The judgment, dated March 27, 1992, indicates that Leydon was convicted of money laundering under U.S.C.§1957 (a)&2, which is a Class C felony. She was sentenced to 36 months probation with 240 hours of community service and ordered to pay a total of \$3,050 in fines and assessments.
- 5. Because Leydon's felony conviction involves a crime of dishonesty, under 18 U.S.C. 1033 she is required to obtain the director's express consent to work in the business of insurance, which to date she has not done although she is employed at the firm of Montgomery & Collins Inc. of Alaska.
- Leydon's felony conviction is a basis to deny a license under
 AS 21.27.410(a)(7).
- Pursuant to AS 21.27.020(a), 21.27.020(b)(4) and (6), and
 21.27.410(a)(7), the application of Roseanne M. Leydon for an insurance producer license is hereby DENIED.
