37 Alaskan Youth Decide To Change The World!

(Anchorage)

The 9th annual Alaska Points of Light Youth Leadership Institute was conducted June 16-20, 2006. 37 Alaskan youth ages 13-21 spent 5 full days learning about team communication, personal assessment, community assessment, problem statement skills, mapping community problems and resources, examining causes of problems, creativity skills, effective decision making, personal goal setting, project planning and organizing, managing a project for quality, national and community service learning, exploring diversity and creative leadership 101.

Students from Anchorage, Palmer, Wasilla, Kenai, Soldotna, and Kodiak participated in the five day training at the Carlquist Conference Center near Mirror Lake. The last day of the PYLI training was spent in Anchorage staying at the First CME Church organizing and preparing for 2 service projects on Tuesday, June 20. PYLI students worked in service teams for two hours under the direction of Anchorage Parks & Recreation Volunteer Coordinator, Nancy Beardsley, to revitalize David Green Park through cleaning and greening activities in the playground areas, flower beds, picnic shelter, parking areas, and other public areas. In the afternoon, PYLI students walked to the Northern Lights School where Camp Providence conducts its day camp for 120 children. Under the direction of Camp Coordinator, Anita Leamy, PYLI students worked in teams to engage children in team work and trust building activities designed to help them have fun while learning to work cooperatively with others.

The 9 PYLI graduate assistants and 28 PYLI student participants completed the 50 hour community leadership and service training program at 5:00 p.m. on Monday. After the PYLI training, students return to their schools and communities to apply their leadership skills and are asked to perform 10 hours of volunteer service to improve their community. Upon returning to school in the Fall, the June PYLI Class will draw attention to and perform volunteer service during the week starting Monday, September 11, a national day of service, which marks the 5th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks in New York City and Washington, D.C. Those completing their 10 hours of volunteer service will graduate from PYLI on October 28, National Make A Difference Day.
