0104-96-1 Allegation that a registered land surveyor's work was below the minimum professional standards for a land surveyor. (Referred 08/21/98)

0104-98-2 Allegation that a registered land surveyor did not provide services in a timely manner. (Referred 08/21/98)

ACCUSATION FILED

0103-95-10 Patrick W. Moore, Professional Civil Engineer License 5327, did not renew his license to practice engineering on December 31, 1993, therefore his license lapsed on January 1, 1994. Moore continued to practice engineering but he did not renew his license to practice engineering until January 28, 1996. Moore also continued to advertise in telephone yellow pages under the heading "Engineers-Consulting" as "AM Engineering, Lucas Road, Wasilla.....376-1090" during the period his license lapsed. (Accusation filed 06/21/01)

0103-98-3 Moore again allowed his license to practice engineering to lapse on December 31, 1997. On October 21, 1998, and while his license to practice engineering was lapsed, Moore submitted signed and sealed structural engineering plans and calculations to the Department of Public Work, Municipality of Anchorage that concerned an addition to the Fish & Wildlife Building, 1011 East Tudor road, Anchorage, Alaska. (Accusation filed 06/21/01)

CASES CLOSED:

0101-02-2 Allegation that an unlicensed person worked as an architect. Investigation revealed that a general contractor started to construct a public building without having a registered architect prepare plans for the building. The contractor subsequently hired a registered architect, who prepared plans for the building. An advisory letter was sent to the general contractor. (Closed 10/29/02)

0102-02-3 Allegation that an engineer violated professional ethics in the practice of engineering. Investigation revealed that the engineer failed to obtain approval for a modification to a wastewater system design approved by DEC. The engineer supervised the installation and DEC subsequently approved the system for use. An advisory letter was sent to the engineer. This closure was coordinated with AELS Board Member Robert Miller. (Closed 10/29/02)

0103-02-5 Allegation that an unlicensed person worked as an engineer on a project in Alaska. Investigation revealed that the individual, who was licensed in another jurisdiction, practiced engineering on new construction. The

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individual was subsequently licensed as an engineer in Alaska. This closure was discussed with AELS Board Member Robert Miller. (Closed 09/03/02)

0103-02-6 Allegation that an unlicensed person worked as an engineer on a project in Alaska. Investigation revealed that the individual, who was licensed in another jurisdiction, practiced engineering on new construction. The individual was subsequently licensed as an engineer in Alaska. This closure was discussed with AELS Board Member Robert Miller. (Closed 09/03/02)

0103-02-7 Allegation that an unlicensed person worked as an engineer on a project in Alaska. Investigation revealed the individual practiced engineering in the process of replacing a boiler in a public building. An advisory letter was sent to the individual having the majority of responsibility for the boiler replacement. This closure was reviewed with AELS Board Member Kathleen Gardner. (Closed 10/15/02)

0105-02-1 Allegation that a land surveyor continued to work while his license was lapsed. Investigation substantiated the allegation. When contacted and advised that his license was lapsed the land surveyor renewed his license. An advisory letter was sent to the land surveyor. This closure was discussed with AELS Board Member Pat Kalen. (Closed 10/29/02)

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
