#### **NARRATIVE STATEMENT**

#### **BOARD MISSION**

The board adopts regulations to carry out its mission to protect the public health, safety, and welfare through the regulation of the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying, and landscape architecture by:

- ensuring that those entering these practices meet minimum standards of competency, and maintain such standards during their practice;
- requiring licensure to practice in the State of Alaska; and
- enforcing both the licensure and competency requirements in a fair and uniform manner. (Dated 2/15/00)

<u>Board Meetings</u>: The Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers and Land Surveyors held four 2-day meetings and one teleconference in FY 09 as follows:

<u>Application Review</u>: During FY 09 the board reviewed 511 applications for registration and/or examination. One application was denied and 30 were found to be incomplete.

<u>Investigations/Disciplinary Processes</u>. The AELS Board considers investigation procedures and enforcement to be one of its most important responsibilities.

During FY 09 a Special Committee of the board completed a manual to assist the board's investigator in assessing fines and penalties for like disciplinary actions.

# SUNSET PERFORMANCE AUDIT RECOMMENDATIONS (From the 2008 Audit)

# Recommendation No. 1: Review registration fees as provided by statute and consider decreasing fees.

The Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing will be reviewing registration fees for the upcoming 12/31/09 renewal.

Recommendation No. 2: Ensure that Corporations, Limited Liability Companies and Limited Liability Partnerships are licensed in accordance with state regulations.

The absence of a Statement of Responsibility pursuant to 12 AAC 36.135(7) was recognized as not being required and rectified by staff prior to the Legislative Audit Report.

## <u>Recommendation No. 3: Office of the Governor should fill vacant seats in a timely manner.</u>

This is beyond the control of the AELS Board; however the Executive Administrator works closely with the Office of the Governor, Board and Commissions, to see that board appointments and reappointments are made timely.

#### **UPCOMING REGULATION PROJECTS**

The board currently has no regulation projects being public noticed.

The board will be pursuing amendments to 12 AAC 36.105, Comity Regulations.

Currently filed with the Lt. Governor's office are changes to 12 AAC 36.100 and .105, Comity Regulations, with an effective date of July 19, 2009.

Adopted at the May 2009 board meeting and currently with the Department of Law for review and approval are changes to the tables in 12 AAC 36.062, .063, .064, and .065, which change the requirements for eligibility to sit for the Fundamentals of Surveying, Professional Surveying, Fundamentals of Engineering, and Professional Engineering examinations.

#### **LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS**

The board will be seeking changes to AS 08.48.281 (Prohibited Practice), AS 08.48.291 (Violations and Penalties) and AS 08.48.331(a)(7) (specialty contractor exemption).

In addition the board will be asking the division to seek changes to bring professional geologists under the regulation and governance of the AELS Board. (AS 08.02.011).

The board also supports the efforts of the Alaska Chapter of the American Society of Landscape Architects (ASLA) to change the landscape architect seat on the board to a permanent, voting seat.
