**NCEES news**

Beginning in July, examinees will register using the new NCEES Examinee Management System. The new system will allow boards to track a candidate's exam attempts across jurisdictions, with the goal of strengthening exam security and enforcing limits on number of exam attempts.

The current *Structural I & II* exams will be offered for the last time in October 2010. Beginning April 2011, the new 16-hour Structural exam will be offered.

The PM Civil exam will be split into five individual books, the Mechanical into three; candidates will have to choose their module upon registration. The FE exam book will be split into seven modules.

In a regular survey NCEES conducts with FE exam candidates, only 60% said they understand licensure requirements. The *Evaluation of Applications Task Force* is investigating ways to make the application processes more consistent both for initial and comity licensure in an effort to create more user-friendly processes.

**NCARB**

The Six-month Rule goes into effect July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010, for all interns.

NCARB has received increased requests from Record holders for transmittal of IDP records, and reminds members that they must maintain an active membership to utilize the record transmittal service.

The 2009 survey shows that there are 101,673 registered architects in the U.S., and just under 220,000 registrations. On average, an architect is registered in a least two different jurisdictions.
