## REGULATIONS

Regulation updates to 12 AAC 36.060, .061, .062, .063, .064, .065, .105, and .990 were submitted to the Lieutenant Governor on Friday, April 21<sup>st</sup> and signed on Tuesday, April 25<sup>th</sup>. The regulation updates will take effect on **Thursday, May 25, 2017**.

## LEGISLATION

**House Bill 48:** An act relating to the composition of the State Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers and Land Surveyors; extending the termination date of the State Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers and Land Surveyors; and providing for an effective date.

HB 48 extends the AELS board until 2025 and makes the landscape architect seat permanent after 19 years as a temporary seat on the board. The bill passed on April 13, 2017 and is currently awaiting the Governor's signature.

**House Bill 90:** An Act relating to occupational licensing fees; relating to an occupational investigation surcharge; and providing for an effective dates.

HB 90 was referred to rules on April 21, 2017. The board made a motion to oppose the bill. For more information, see ACTION ITEMS – MOTIONS on page 3.

## **APPLICATION REVIEW**

The board reviewed **61** applications for registration by comity, examination, and grandfathering at the April meeting.

**30** applications were approved.

**28** applications were conditionally approved pending receipt of additional documentation.

**3** applications were found to be incomplete and will be reviewed again at the next meeting upon receipt of additional documentation.

## **OUTREACH ACTIVITIES**

Following the board's regularly scheduled meeting nine of the ten board members and board staff conducted a Q&A session at the UAF College of Engineering and Mines. Eight students, three faculty and two office staff attended. The Chair provided an overview of the AELS board and its functions. Additional topics covered during the event included: regulation updates related to the FE and FS application process, Model Law and pathways for licensure, documenting work experience, use of NCEES Record and AELS resources. Board staff developed and distributed a tri-fold brochure entitled FAQs for Engineering & Geomatic Students to the attendees.

For all new PE/PS/ARE/LARE exam applicants, applications and supporting documents must be received in the Juneau office **30 DAYS PRIOR** to board meetings. There will be NO exceptions.

The application deadline for the next two meetings are:

- July 5, 2017 for review at the August meeting.
- October 4, 2017 for review at the November meeting

## **NCEES Exam Applicants:**

Effective May 25, 2017 applications for the Fundamentals of Engineering (FE) and Fundamentals of Surveying (FS) examinations are no longer required. To register and schedule an FE or FS exam, please visit the <u>NCEES website</u>.

To retake a failed PE exam, a written request must be submitted to our Juneau office a minimum of 5 days prior to the registration deadline set by NCEES.

As a reminder, the PS exam is now a computer-based test (CBT) and is available all year. There is no deadline for registration for the PS exam, however a written request must be submitted to the Juneau office to retake.

There will be no Chemical PE exam offered in October. Beginning in January 2018, the Chemical PE exam will only be offered as a CBT.

#### **AKLS Exam Applicants:**

The Alaska Land Surveyors (AKLS) exam is offered annually in April. The deadline for applications for the AKLS exam is **30 DAYS PRIOR** to board meetings.

The board recommends applicants submit their application for review at the November meeting. In the event the application is found incomplete, the applicant still has an opportunity to submit updates for review at the February meeting and be approved in time to sit the exam in April.

The deadline for the February meeting is January 10, 2018.


#### **STAFF REPORTS**
