Protecting the health, safety, and welfare of Alaskans through the creation of and adherence to the highest standards of excellence in the licensure and regulation of physicians, physician assistants, and paramedics.

Board Meetings

During FY 09, the board met four times in person and two times via teleconference:

Board Appointments

Drs. David A. Miller and David J. Powers and Ms. Kathleen Millar were appointed to the board during the last year.

Application Review

The board approved the issuance of 233 new physician licenses during FY 09. They also issued 70 resident permits and 48 locum tenens permits. Fifty new physician assistant licenses were granted as well as 43 paramedic licenses. Please see the Statistical Overview for additional information.

<u>Investigations/Disciplinary Processes</u>

The State Medical Board considers investigations and enforcement to be one of its most important responsibilities. The board has worked closely with the investigators to insure fair, objective, and impartial actions with all those who are investigated or disciplined. During FY 09, 37 formal board actions were taken by the board in executing its mandate to protect the public.

During FY 09, the board maintained its consistently high level of activity in all categories of licensure.

The results of a national survey ranked Alaska number one in the nation for the number of disciplinary sanctions against physicians, per capita. This is the 20th consecutive

year the Alaska State Medical Board has placed in the top ten states in country in this ranking of board performance. We believe these statistics reflect the Alaska board's vigorous and objective enforcement of the laws that regulate the practice of medicine in Alaska and the board's commitment to the safety and well being of the citizens of this state.

National and Regional Meetings

The executive administrator for the board is an elected member of the board of directors of the Federation of State Medical Boards. In that capacity, she had attended the annual meeting of the Federation and two board of directors' meetings of the Federation. The board recognizes the honor bestowed on Alaska with her participation in these activities and believes that this work helps to keep the board abreast of national trends, other states' standards for licensure, and emerging issues before the board. The board chair also attended the annual meeting of the Federation and with the executive administrator, met with Alaska's two senators, the Honorable Lisa Murkowski and the Honorable Mark Begich.

The executive administrator's expenses for attending these meetings are paid by the Federation and represent no cost to the state. The board chair's attendance at the annual meeting was also paid by the Federation, a practice the Federation offers for all state boards to encourage attendance and participation.

The executive administrator, as past president of Administrators In Medicine, also serves as chairperson of the national Certification of State Medical Board Investigators program.

Regulations Adopted

During the last fiscal year, the board adopted regulations pertaining to collaborative relationships for physician assistants, lapsed physician license applications, continuing medical education, independent medical evaluations, reinstatement of a surrendered license, and unprofessional conduct.



SUNSET PERFORMANCE AUDIT RECOMMENDATIONS

The board is scheduled to sunset June 30, 2013.

In the last legislative sunset audit, there were no major deficiencies found with the operations of the medical board.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal No. 1

To continue to protect the public and safeguard the health and safety of the public by:

- maintaining the highest standards of licensure in the country insuring that only the most competent physicians practice in Alaska and insure their continued competency;
- vigorously and objectively enforce the statutes and regulations of the state of Alaska that define the practice of medicine;
- provide information and education to both our licensees and the population about the board and its work.

Objective

Continuously review and revise our licensing requirements seeking ways to improve our processes. Restore the board's newsletter that was eliminated several years ago and improve our communications with our licensees and the public. Continue to work collaboratively with the Investigations Unit to pursue and resolve complaints filed with the board.

Goal No. 2

Promulgate statutes and regulations that are clear, relevant, unambiguous, and functional.

<u>Objective</u>

To continuously improve language in the statutes and regulations for clarity and to be aware of and responsive to changes in practice of medicine.

Goal No. 3

Increase the public and professional awareness of the board and its activities.

Objective

To resume the publication of a board newsletter to keep our licensing population and the public informed of the board's activities and perspective.

Goal No. 4

Continue to develop and promote positive relationships with our colleagues in other organizations such as other boards, the Federation of State Medical Boards, Administrators In Medicine, the National Board of Medical Examiners, the Education Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates, the American Board of Medical Specialties, and other professional organizations.

Objective

Through our positive relationships with other organizations, the board seeks to stay abreast of developments in physician education, training, development, recruitment, and retention.

Goal No. 5

Pursue within the Division of Corporations, Business, and Professional Licensing adequate financial and human resources to create and maintain an effective operational structure so that the board can meet its mission and goals. The board recognizes the increased work load over the years and will be seeking to add an additional staff member in the Anchorage office to assist with its administrative functions.

Objective

The board seeks to serve its licensing population with competent, courteous, and prompt assistance when called upon. In order to achieve our objective, we need to provide adequate resources to our staff including compensation and a positive work environment. The board seeks to utilize technology in the most efficient ways possible to achieve its goals and to provide the best service possible to both our licensees and the public.

Goal No. 6

Pursue with the Division the board's desire to have the licensing examiners and board license records moved to the Anchorage office.

<u>Objective</u>

The board recognizes the increased efficiency to its operations with all personnel and records located in the largest population center in the state rather than maintaining two office locations. The board also recognizes the increased cost savings and security of records this move would provide.

BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FY 2010

Office Move \$30,000

The board seeks to have adequate funding made available to provide for the move of personnel and records to the Anchorage office in order to combine the two offices into a more efficient and cost effective operation.

Educational Meetings \$5,000

The board requests adequate funding to permit attendance at appropriate educational meetings during the year for its staff.

The board does not anticipate any other special funding projects at this time.

UPCOMING REGULATIONS PROJECTS

The board has a new regulations project in the beginning stages and will be moving forward with it in the coming weeks. The project involves regulations regarding standard of care, the use of the title "Doctor" by non-physicians, supervision of paramedics, the licensure of Fifth Pathway physicians, and additional language to the unprofessional conduct regulation. These regulations do not involve any expenditure of funds.

No other projects are contemplated at this time.

LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS

The medical board is not seeking any legislative changes to its statutes at this time.
