## Dear licensees and interested parties:

Alaska's professional licensing statutes (AS 08.01.065) require the Division of Corporations, Business and Professional Licensing (CBPL) to "annually review each fee level to determine whether the regulatory costs of each occupation are approximately equal to fee collections related to that occupation." Alaska's licensing fee statutes go on to say, "If the review indicates that an occupation's fee collections and regulatory costs are not approximately equal, the department shall calculate fee adjustments and adopt regulations...to implement the adjustments."

As licensed naturopaths are aware, the Naturopathy program has been struggling with a substantial deficit and its ability to cover operating expenses for many years. Fees were increased in FY2016, but the increase thus far has not been enough to cover biennial program expenses. This means the deficit is continuing to grow despite the last fee increase. The Division of Legislative Audit, as well as the Alaska State Legislature itself, has been outspoken of its criticism of fees not being set high enough to comply with the statutory requirements mentioned above.

With legal and investigative costs remaining high, the total biennial expenses remain substantially higher than biennial revenues as shown in the spreadsheet below. In addition, the carryforward deficit must also be retired. FY2017 ending balance was \$153,214 in deficit. Due to these circumstances, the fee for a naturopath license is being proposed at \$1,800 per biennium.

Below is a comparison of calculations based on the Division's proposed increase in fees, along with comparative fiscal forecasts using these estimates:

Should costs to this program reduce over time, a future fee analysis may determine that a fee reduction is warranted.

This fee proposal is entering a public comment period. The division encourages all licensees and interested parties to comment on this proposal through the division's regulations specialist, whose contact information is enclosed and on the public notice. After the comment period closes and the division reviews all comments received, the division may adopt the regulation as drafted, may amend a proposed fee, or may withdraw the regulations in part or in whole.

All comments received will be reviewed and taken into consideration prior to adopting the final regulations. The final decision will result in the fee to be implemented in time to be effective for the upcoming license renewal this March.
