IMPOSITION OF CIVIL FINE

Case # 2014-000655

Medco Health Solutions of Las Vegas #421 (hereafter referred to as Medco Health #421) admits and agrees that the Alaska Board of Pharmacy (Board) has jurisdiction over the subject matter of their license in Alaska and over this Imposition of Civil Fine.

- 1. The Board alleges that Medco Health #421 admits during their Biennial license renewal period from 2008-2014, failed to disclose information concerning prior licensing actions against one of their companies in violation of 12 AAC 52.920 (a)(13) and 12 AAC 052.991.
- 2. Medco Health #421 believes the error was due to the group's interpretation concerning the Maine discipline. Further Medco Health #421 changed their compliance procedures in order to meet the standards in the settlement with the Maine incident. Lastly, Medco Health #421 states there was no intention to deceive the Board of Pharmacy in this application matter.

Medco Health #421 does not contest that the Board's allegations, which if proven could be grounds for possible denial of licensure or other disciplinary sanctions of their license pursuant to AS 08.80.030 (b)(5), AS 08.01.075, AS 08.80.261 and 12 AAC 52.920. In order to resolve this matter, Medco Health #421 is agreeing to this Imposition of a Civil Fine of one thousand dollars (\$1000) in cash, certified check, or money order payable to the "State of Alaska" within ninety (90) days after this Imposition of Civil Fine is accepted by the Board.

Medco Health #421 has the right to consult with an attorney and the right to have an administrative hearing on the facts in this case. Medco Health #421 understands and agrees that by voluntarily signing this Imposition of Civil Fine, they are waiving their rights to counsel and to a hearing on this matter.
