CUSATION AND FINAL ORDER

of the Division of Insurance (Division), Department of nomic Development (DCCED), State of Alaska, states is based as follows:

- 023, MONTGOMERY CORTES (CORTES), te of California applied for an Insurance Producer roperty and Casualty authority with the Division to usiness in the State of Alaska.
- application, CORTES responded negatively to ns 1B, indicating no felony convictions to report to the State of Alaska. CORTES responded affirmatively to background

question 2, indicating administrative actions was taken against him, yet he did not provide the required disclosures for the affirmative response.

- The State of Florida took administrative action against CORTES for failure to disclose his criminal history, which resulted in a permanent bar from licensure in Florida effective June 27, 2016.
- 4. The Producer Database and Attachment Warehouse reflects a felony conviction in the State of California in effect October 14, 1987. CORTES failed to disclose his felony conviction to the Division and provided incorrect information on his application.
- 5. On September 28, 2023, correspondence was provided to CORTES informing of his failure to respond accurately to background question 1B regarding felony convictions. In the same correspondence the Division also requested clarification and additional documentation in support of the affirmative answer to background question 2. No response was received from CORTES.
- 6. On October 10, 2023, the Division received a status update request from a representative from Patra Corp, claiming to be the authorized submitter for CORTES. The application did not list an authorized submitter. The Division requested documentation from CORTES indicating Patra Corp had authorization to receive status updates on the license application. No response from CORTES was received.
- 7. On October 13, 2023, a representative of Patra Corp emailed the Division with a written statement available in the Attachment Warehouse for

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CORTES. The documentation provided was incomplete, and on the same day, the Division requested a statement from CORTES authorizing the Division to engage with Patra Corp on his behalf. No response was received. The Division provided additional correspondence to CORTES indicating the outstanding deficiencies on the application.

- 8. Alaska Statute (AS) 21.27.040(a) states that "(a) Application for a license shall be made to the director upon forms prescribed by the director. As a part of or in connection with the application, the applicant shall furnish information concerning the applicant's identity, personal history, experience, business record, purposes, and other pertinent facts that the director may reasonably require. The applicant shall declare, subject to penalty of denial, nonrenewal, suspension, or revocation of a license issued by the director, that the statements made in or in connection with the application are true, correct, and complete to the best of the applicant's knowledge and belief…"
- 9. AS 21.27.020(a) provides: "For the protection of the people of this state, the director may not issue or renew a license except in compliance with this chapter and not issue a license to a person, or to be exercised by a person, found by the director to be untrustworthy, incompetent, or who has not established to the satisfaction of the director that the person is qualified under this chapter."
